LOCAL ACTION TO MANAGE FLOOD RISK IN NORTH LINCOLNSHIRE – PROGRESS REPORT

1. OBJECT AND KEY POINTS IN THIS REPORT

1.1 To consider an action plan in response to the recommendations of the Safer and Stronger Communities Scrutiny Panel in relation to local action taken to manage flood risk in North Lincolnshire.

2. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

- 2.1 At its meeting on 3 February 2010, cabinet approved a report of the Safer and Stronger Communities Panel entitled "Local Action taken to manage flood risk in North Lincolnshire".
- 2.2 A recommendation of the cabinet report was that an action plan in response to the Safer and Stronger Communities Scrutiny Panel Report be prepared for submission to a future meeting of the cabinet.
- 2.3 The Service Director, Highways and Planning agreed on behalf of other Service Directors and Cabinet Members to assume overall ownership of preparing and implementing an action plan to address the recommendations in the scrutiny report.
- 2.4 The action plan updated to May 2010 was presented to the Safer and Stronger Communities Panel on 3 June 2010.

3. OPTIONS FOR CONSIDERATION

3.1 To receive the action plan report.

4 ANALYSIS OF OPTIONS

4.1 The action plan reflects progress made by the multi agency North Lincolnshire Flood Forum and the constructive challenge from the council's scrutiny process.

5 **RESOURCE IMPLICATIONS (FINANCIAL, STAFFING, PROPERTY, IT)**

- 5.1 Financial.
 - 5.1.1 There are considerable financial challenges associated with the enactment of the Flood and Water Management (FAWM) Act which is the Government response to the Pitt Report which undertook a comprehensive review of the lessons to be learned

from the summer floods of 2007. These continue to be considered.

5.2 Staffing.

5.2.1 The statutory requirements of the FAWM Act will have an impact on staffing skills and capacity required to deliver its obligations.

6. OTHER IMPLICATIONS (STATUTORY, ENVIRONMENTAL, DIVERSITY, SECTION17 - CRIME AND DISORDER, RISK AND OTHER)

6.1 Statutory

- 6.1.1 The Flood and Water Management Act (FAWM) received Royal Assent in April 2010 with an anticipated introduction in April 2011. The Act requires lead local flood authorities, of which North Lincolnshire Council is one, to develop, maintain and apply a strategy for local flood risk in its area. The strategy must show proposed measures to deliver objectives and how those measures are to be paid for as well as their costs and benefits.
- 6.1.2 The FAWM Act puts a responsibility on all authorities to have a regard to the scrutiny process of the lead authority to review and scrutinise the flood risk management in its area.

6.2 Environmental and Other

6.2.1 Under the FAWM Act, the strategy will need to show how it contributes to the achievement of wider environmental objectives.

7. OUTCOMES OF CONSULTATION.

7.1 The action plan was prepared for and discussed by the multi agency North Lincolnshire Flood Forum. Actions and progress by Flood Forum members has been incorporated.

8. **RECOMMENDATIONS.**

- 8.1 That cabinet notes the report on the scrutiny action plan;
- 8.2 And requests that all reasonable steps be taken to successfully complete actions that are currently in progress.

The Humber LRF uses the Community Risk Register and the review process in place through the LRF Risk Assessment Working Group to address risks, which includes flooding and has reaffirmed that it still remains one of the four highest risks in the Humber sub-region. The outcome of the risk assessment process is endorsed by all multi-agency partners, including North Lincolnshire Council and concerns relating to pollution and health risks will be taken into account in any future emergency planning arrangements. The identification of vulnerable infrastructure has been an ongoing process being addressed through both the water management and resilience agenda, highlighted by the Pitt Review and the NLC scrutiny process. The outcomes of the process have been identified in the compilation of the NLC Multi Agency Flood Plan. Further work to complete this recommendation is to ensure that mapping of the critical infrastructure is undertaken by NLC GIS team.

The LRF Multi-Agency Flood Plan for North Lincolnshire has recently been assessed as satisfactory (the second highest level) by DEFRA and will achieve the highest level of satisfaction when the mapping requirements are complete (see Rec1 update above). The LRF Emergency Procedures Manual has also been updated in accordance with the Humber sub-regional Flooding debrief process and the NLC scrutiny process. It is considered that resources available to multi agency partners have improved, although there are national issues relating to resources and lack of legislation, such as the Fire and Rescue Service and water rescue.
