OUTCOMES OF YOUTH SERVICE SCRUTINY REVIEW: PROGRESS UPDATE

1. OBJECT AND KEY POINTS IN THIS REPORT

1.1 To report progress on the actions undertaken in response to the recommendations of the Children and Young People's Scrutiny Panel in relation to the Review of the Youth Service.

2. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

- 2.1 The Youth Service Scrutiny report was published in June 2007. The government further clarified its policy agenda with the publication of Positive Activities Aiming High A Ten Year Strategy (July 2007) and of Targeted Youth Support (June 2009). This set a direction of travel for the delivery of Youth Services in the context of a group of services, which make up Integrated Youth Support.
- 2.2 The work required to deliver the recommendations of the Youth Service Scrutiny Report were mapped against the actions required to deliver the government's required policy agenda. A combined approach was taken to achieve economy of effort.
- 2.3 The scope and scale of work to implement the recommendations and respond to the government policy required a whole systems review; the incorporation of the Connexions Service into the local authority; review and realignment of budgets and the alignment of the management arrangements for the newly configured Integrated Youth Support Service.
- 2.4 The Head of Integrated Youth Support Services reported progress to Children's Services Cabinet Member in September 2008. The service review process had to follow legal and human resources requirements. As a consequence there has been a delay in completing the action plan.
- 2.5 All of the service requirements have been completed which means delivery is congruent with resources and there has been no duplication of effort in responding to the actions required by the scrutiny panel and meeting government requirements.
- 2.6 The outcomes have been reported to and accepted by the scrutiny panel in March 2010. All service recommendations have been met.

2.7 The scrutiny process has been helpful. The recommendations will support continued improvement.

3. OPTIONS FOR CONSIDERATION

3.1 There are no options associated with this report.

4. ANALYSIS OF OPTIONS

4.1 There are no options for analysis.

5. RESOURCE IMPLICATIONS (FINANCIAL, STAFFING, PROPERTY, IT)

- 5.1 The implementation of the recommendations of the Scrutiny report has supported Youth Service in meeting its duty to provide positive activities for young people within allocated resources.
- 5.2 Staffing The roles and responsibilities of staff will continue to be reviewed.
- 5.3 Property Increased activity in the youth centres by the wider community will represent value for money.
- 5.4 IT any ICT requirement can be met within budget savings already identified.

6. OTHER IMPLICATIONS (STATUTORY, ENVIRONMENTAL, DIVERSITY, SECTION 17 - CRIME AND DISORDER, RISK AND OTHER)

Section 17 Crime and Disorder Act 1998:- The duty for each authority to exercise its various functions with due regard to the likely effect of the exercise of those functions on and the need to do all that is reasonable to prevent crime and disorder in its area.

- 6.1 Over time the increase in capacity will provide diversionary activity, supporting the council in exercising its S17 duty.
- 6.2 Increased investment in the provision of activities would have immediate impact upon the capacity of the Integrated Youth Support Service to provide places to go and things to do providing both universal access and diversionary activities supporting the S17 duty.

Section 507b. Education Act 1996:- 'as far as reasonably practicable' secure for young people 'sufficient' educational and recreational leisure time activities which are 'for the improvement of their well- being'.

6.3 The reallocation of resources enables more efficient use of staffing and resources in order for the council to meet Section 507b duties.

7. OUTCOMES OF CONSULTATION

- 7.1 The development of integrated youth support services has included all staff and partners in several consultation events.
- 7.2 Union representatives are being continually consulted no issues have been raised.
- 7.3 The outcomes of the scrutiny review have been reported into the scrutiny process.

8. **RECOMMENDATIONS**

- 8.1 That Cabinet notes the report in relation to the review of the Youth Service.
- 8.2 That Cabinet supports that all reasonable steps be taken to successfully complete actions that are currently in progress.
