LICENSING ACT 2003 APPLICATION TO VARY A PREMISES LICENCE AM PM EXPRESS, 12 SCOTTER ROAD, SCUNTHORPE

1. OBJECT AND KEY POINTS IN THIS REPORT

- 1.1 To request that the Sub-Committee determines the application to vary a Premises Licence for AM PM Express, 12 Scotter Road. A summary of the application is attached as Appendix A to this report and a copy of the application as Appendix B.
- 1.2 There have been 11 representations received, which have been deemed relevant. These are detailed in paragraph 4.2. Copies of the representations are attached to this report at Appendix C, D, E, F, G, H, I, J, K, L and M.

2. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

- 2.1 In accordance with the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003 and the council's scheme of delegation, all applications for a licence where a relevant representation has been made need to be determined by this Sub-Committee.
- 2.2 When determining the application the Sub-Committee should only consider issues which relate to the four licensing objectives. The licensing objectives are:
 - The prevention of Crime and Disorder
 - Public Safety
 - The prevention of a Public Nuisance
 - The protection of Children from Harm
- 2.3 Members of the Sub-Committee must have regard to the statutory guidance issued under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003, our Statement of Licensing Policy and our Cumulative Impact Policy if appropriate. Members of the Sub-Committee may deviate from the statutory guidance and licensing policies only if they deem that there is good reason to do so. Where Members do deviate from the statutory guidance or policies then full reasons must be provided.

- 2.4 Members of the Sub-Committee should not allow themselves to predetermine the application or to be prejudiced in favour or opposed to the licence and shall only determine the application having had an opportunity to consider all relevant facts. Members of the Sub-Committee should not hear or decide on any applications for premises licences in their own ward.
- 2.5 Members of the Sub-Committee shall remember that they are acting in a quasi-judicial role in determining the application and shall remain in the room so that they hear all the evidence before determining the application. The determination shall be based on the evidence provided, which is relevant to the licensing objectives.
- 2.6 The options available to the Sub-Committee having considered all the relevant information are as follows:
 - To refuse to vary the licence
 - To vary the licence with additional conditions
 - To vary the licence without additional conditions
 - To vary the licence but restrict the licensable activities
 - To vary the licence with restricted times
- 2.7 When considering an application to vary a licence, only the additional elements contained within the application can be considered. The activities already licensed cannot be subject to any restriction or additional conditions.
- 2.8 Members of the Sub-Committee should be advised that the applicant, responsible authorities and other persons making relevant representations may appeal to the Magistrates Court within 21 days of the date on which they were notified of the decision

3. **ISSUES FOR CONSIDERATION**

- 3.1 The application to vary a premises licence for AM PM Express, 12 Scotter Road was received on 16 February 2016. A summary of the application is attached at Appendix A and a copy of the application is attached at Appendix B.
- 3.2 Environmental Health (Commercial) has objected to the application on the grounds of the prevention of public nuisance. A copy of the representation is attached at Appendix C.
- 3.3 Humberside Police have submitted a representation but they have no objections to the application. A copy of the representation is attached at Appendix D.

- 3.4 Humberside Fire and Rescue have submitted a representation but they have no objections to the application. A copy of the representation is attached at Appendix E.
- 3.5 Public Health have submitted a representation but they have no objections to the application. A copy of the representation is attached at Appendix F.
- 3.6 There have been 7 representations from other persons, which have been deemed relevant. The representations are detailed in paragraph 4.2 and are attached to this report as Appendix G to M.
- 3.7 The applicant has been made aware of the representations.

a) General – all four licensing objectives (b,c,d,e) (please read guidance note 9)

The store will operate to a high standard, and will do so should this licence be granted in terms of the sale of alcohol. All staff will be fully trained in their responsibilities with regard to the sale of alcohol, and will be retrained every six months, with recorded training records kept for inspection. The store is looking to trade for 24 hours and would like the licence to be available during all the trading hours of the store. ALL CURRENT CONDITIONS TO REMAIN ON THE LICENCE. Except Challenge 21 to be replaced with challenge 25.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

An extensive CCTV system will be in operation to provide security and identify any culprit who is intent in causing trouble in store. There will be a monitor on the shop floor as well as a monitor on the Managers office. All images are stored for a period of 31 days after which they can be erased or saved at the request of the police. All current security measures will remain in operation. All staff will be fully trained in the operation of the CCTV system. Images will be made available to the police or authorised licensing officer from the council on request.

c) Public safety

Staff will be trained to be alert to any potential danger to customers and react accordingly. If they are unable to quickly difuse the situation without risk to customer or staff, then they are instructed to call the police. All relevant fire procedures are in place for a store of this size.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

Given this is a forecourt site no one will be permitted to hang around outside the premises thus having the potential of causing nuisance to customers, either in requesting they purchase alcohol on their behalf, or general intimidating behaviour. The entrance to the store is also visible from the till point area, and so can be monitored by the staff. CCTV cameras will also pick up any disturbance in this area. The business has external cameras to assist with any potential problem.

e) The protection of children from harm

Only photographic ID is accepted (passport, driving licence, proof of age card with PASS hologram). Anyone who appears to be under the age of 25 is challenged to provide ID. If the customer is unable to provide identification then no sale is made. No ID no sale. Any staff member who may be under the age of 18 must call a senior staff member to take over the sale and complete the transaction. If it is known that a customer intends to purchase alcohol to provide to minors then that sale will be refused.

Thank you for your consultation on the above application.

AM PM Express is located within a residential area and I am concerned that local residents will be disturbed by noise from customers visiting the premises, both to purchase alcohol and other items.

Historically this department has received complaints in relation to noise and light from the premises. By extending the opening hours it is likely that local residents will be disturbed during the night time hours by such noises as car engines, the opening and closing of car doors, and the noise from car stereos. Furthermore by allowing the 24 hour selling of alcohol it may encourage the gathering of people some of whom maybe intoxicated, this in turn may also lead to anti-social behaviour. This department does not see any way that noise from customers and antisocial behaviour associated with the sale of alcohol could be controlled.

Also, there are no restrictions on deliveries, by opening 24 hours the business will be able to receive deliveries during noise sensitive hours.

This application, if approved, will have a detrimental impact upon the local area, leading to noise disturbance if approved and being mindful of the prevention of public nuisance licensing objective, I **object** to this application.

Fire Risk Assessment

It is a requirement that the responsible person must make a suitable and sufficient assessment of the risks to which relevant persons are exposed for the purpose of identifying the general fire precautions which are necessary to comply with the requirements and prohibitions imposed on him by or under this order and record the prescribed information

The following should be considered as essential to any such fire risk assessment:

Means of Escape

The rear fire exit must be available at all material times that the premises is occupied.

Exit routes must be kept clear at all material times.

All final exit doors should be quickly and easily openable in the event of a fire without the use of a key or code.





Means of Giving Warning of Fire

The fire alarm system should conform to British Standard 5839: Part I: 2013.

Emergency Lighting

If the premises are to be used during hours of darkness, and there is insufficient borrowed lighting, a suitable emergency lighting system must be provided in those areas and their associated escape routes, including external escape routes.

The area where the garage is situated is in a densely populated residential area. There have been issues in the past raised by local residents, particularly in the summer months, such as men urinating in broad daylight in full view of local residents and passing traffic. Inappropriate and suggestive comments made to young girls whilst they are visiting the shop.

Residents have huge concerns about the potential for crime and disorder, public safety, anti-social behaviour (which is a NAT priority) and as a society I believe we must do all we can to protect our children and young people; the 24 hour sale of alcohol is a bad example to set for our children.

Re: Application for the variation of premises licence made by **Gurdeep Singh** on **16.02.2016**. For **AM PM Express**, **12 Scotter Road**, Scunthorpe, DN15 8DR for his convenience store/petrol station.

Gurdeep Singh has requested to:

- Extend the hours of sale of alcohol for consumption off the premises to 24 hours, Monday to Sunday
- Permit late night refreshment from 23.00hrs to 5.00hrs Monday to Sunday
- Unrestrict the opening times of the premises

We are writing to give our grounds of objection to all requests.

There are 4 main licensing objectives in the Amended Guidance issued under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 – all are given equal importance when considering license applications.

Our objections concern particularly:

- the prevention of crime and disorders
- the prevention of public nuisance

However public safety and protection of children from harm are a concern too.

You will have access to the complaints made by local residents relating to noise and light pollution from the premises which resulted in some changes being made.

Local residents have also made complaints about the unsocial and offensive behaviours of groups of men who gather on the fire escape of the building (which has accommodation of sorts to the upper storey) in cars and on the grassed area adjacent to the building – under the trees. This area is possibly the 'off the premises' location

referred to in the application. These men drink alcohol leaving their empty cans strewn about. They urinate in public rather than using the facilities in their accommodation.

These behaviours were witnessed as recently as last weekend – they will be more frequent as the weather improves. Totally unacceptable behaviour but we have to put up with it.

We also have a problem with littering in the local area with cans, bottles, sweet wrappers etc dropped in the street/thrown into our gardens.

That's the situation now – with restricted opening hours.


Section 2.18 of the act: relates to public nuisance – noise. This would increase just by the store being open 24/7 but the nature of the changes to provision within the store – late night refreshment/24 hour alcohol sale is likely to attract rowdy clientele. There will be more traffic and slamming car doors etc when residents are trying to sleep.

Section 2.19 of the act: relates to public nuisance - light pollution. The store signs would be neon glowing 24/7.

Section 2.6 of the act: relates to the management competency of the designated premises. The store has had environmental health issues. The local guidance 'scores on the doors' show a paltry 'satisfactory' rating of 3 was managed at the last inspection on 25.01.16. At the previous inspection it scored zero – in urgent need of improvement. Presumably the store management pulled out all the stops to improve hygiene to a standard 2 points below the excellent most establishments manage. The opening hours at the moment allow time for cleaning when the store is closed. If open and providing refreshment including 'late night refreshment' when would the cleaning be done?

We trust that you will reject the application made by Mr. Singh to prevent a further deterioration to the local environment and the well being of its residents.
