**LICENSING ACT 2003  
APPLICATION TO VARY A PREMISES LICENCE  
BRITANNIA NEWS & BOOZE, 11 DONCASTER ROAD, SCUNTHORPE**

**1. OBJECT AND KEY POINTS IN THIS REPORT**

- 1.1 To request that the Sub-Committee determines the application to vary a Premises Licence for Britannia News & Booze. A summary of the application is attached as Appendix A to this report and a copy of the application as Appendix B.
- 1.2 There have been 5 representations received, which have been deemed relevant. These are detailed in paragraph 4.2. Copies of the representations are attached to this report at Appendix C, D, E, F and G.

**2. BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

- 2.1 In accordance with the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003 and the council's scheme of delegation, all applications for a licence where a relevant representation has been made need to be determined by this Sub-Committee.
- 2.2 When determining the application the Sub-Committee should only consider issues which relate to the four licensing objectives. The licensing objectives are:
- The prevention of Crime and Disorder
  - Public Safety
  - The prevention of a Public Nuisance
  - The protection of Children from Harm
- 2.3 Members of the Sub-Committee must have regard to the statutory guidance issued under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003, our Statement of Licensing Policy and our Cumulative Impact Policy if appropriate. Members of the Sub-Committee may deviate from the statutory guidance and licensing policies only if they deem that there is good reason to do so. Where Members do deviate from the statutory guidance or policies then full reasons must be provided.

- 2.4 Members of the Sub-Committee should not allow themselves to pre-determine the application or to be prejudiced in favour or opposed to the licence and shall only determine the application having had an opportunity to consider all relevant facts. Members of the Sub-Committee should not hear or decide on any applications for or relating to premises licences in their own ward.
- 2.5 Members of the Sub-Committee shall remember that they are acting in a quasi-judicial role in determining the application and shall remain in the room so that they hear all the evidence before determining the application. The determination shall be based on the evidence provided, which is relevant to the licensing objectives.
- 2.6 The options available to the Sub-Committee having considered all the relevant information are as follows:
- To refuse to vary the licence
  - To vary the licence with additional conditions
  - To vary the licence without additional conditions
  - To vary the licence but restrict the licensable activities
  - To vary the licence with restricted times
- 2.7 When considering an application to vary a licence, only the additional elements contained within the application can be considered. The activities already licensed cannot be subject to any restriction or additional conditions.
- 2.8 Members of the Sub-Committee should be advised that the applicant, responsible authorities and other persons making relevant representations may appeal to the Magistrates Court within 21 days of the date on which they were notified of the decision

### **3. ISSUES FOR CONSIDERATION**

- 3.1 The application to vary a premises licence for Britannia News & Booze was received on 29 November 2016. A summary of the application is attached at Appendix A and a copy of the application is attached at Appendix B.
- 3.2 Environmental Health has objected to the application on the grounds of the Prevention of Public Nuisance. A copy of the representation is attached at Appendix C.
- 3.3 Humberside Police has objected to the application on the grounds of the Prevention of Crime & Disorder and Public Nuisance. A copy of the representation is attached at Appendix D.
- 3.4 The Licensing Authority has objected to the application on the grounds of the Prevention of Crime & Disorder; Public Nuisance, Protection of Children from Harm and Public Safety. A copy of the representation is attached at Appendix E.

- 3.5 There have been 2 representations from other persons, which have been deemed relevant. The representations are detailed in paragraph 4.2 and are attached to this report as Appendix F and G.
- 3.6 The applicant has been made aware of the representations.
- 3.7 A location plan of the premises is shown at Appendix H and a copy of the current premises licence is shown at Appendix I.

Leading to noise disturbance and anti-social behaviour – impact on prevention of public nuisance objective (see Appendix C).	
2	<p>Humberside Police – in support of the prevention of crime and disorder objective and Prevention of Public Nuisance objective. The area currently has a disproportionately high level of antisocial behaviour during the night and falls within the Cumulative Impact Zone.</p> <p>➤ Evidence of antisocial behaviour has been attached to the representation at Appendix D.</p>	
3	Licensing Authority – the premises are situated in the Cumulative Impact Zone therefore must satisfy they will not have negative impact on crime and disorder, protection of children from harm, public nuisance and public safety objectives.	

	<b>1. The Prevention of Crime and Disorder</b> – include the following CCTV condition to ensure that the CCTV system is fit for purpose:	
	CCTV shall be installed and maintained as follows:	
	a. CCTV must be provided in the form of a continuous recording system providing real time pictures of evidential quality in all lighting conditions. Facial recognition must be provided for pictures of access to and egress from the premises.	
	b. Cameras must be positioned to view all access to and egress from the premises [including fire exits] and all areas where the sale/supply of alcohol occurs.	
	<i>c. Recordings must be correctly time and date marked.</i>	
	<i>d. Recordings must be in date order, numbered sequentially and kept for a minimum period of 31 days.</i>	
	<i>e. The Premises Licence Holder must ensure an appointed member of staff is capable of downloading CCTV footage in a recordable format at all times the premises are operating.</i>	
	<i>f. Recordings must be provided to officers under the direction and control of the Chief Constable of Humberside Police and employees of the Licensing Authority on request.</i>	
	<i>g. The recording equipment and all media used to record data shall be kept in a secure environment under the control of the DPS or other responsible named individual.</i>	
	<i>h. A monitor with a minimum 15" screen must be placed in such a position so as to be viewed by staff working in the [sales / public area] of the premises and by customers.</i>	
	<i>i. CCTV warning signs must be displayed in public areas of the premises</i>	
	<i>j. An operational daily log report must be maintained endorsed by signature, indicating the system has been checked by the DPS or other responsible named individual and is compliant, in the event of any failings actions taken must be recorded.</i>	

	<p>k. <i>CCTV equipment must be maintained in good working order.</i></p> <p>l.</p>	
	<p><b>2. The Prevention of Crime and Disorder</b> – include a condition requiring SIA licensed security staff, as follows:</p>	
	<p>a. Two SIA Licensed Door Supervisors shall be employed in the premises from 23.00 hours until 08.00 hours the following day while used for any regulated activity.</p>	
	<p>b. SIA Licensed Door Supervisors shall not perform any other role either paid or unpaid when employed to carry out security at the premises.</p>	
	<p>c. All SIA Licensed Door Supervisors shall sign a register when they start work at the premises. A copy of this register shall contain their full name, date of birth, SIA licence number, SIA licence expiry date, and the name of the employing agency/door company.</p>	
	<p>d. This register shall be made available for inspection upon the request of an authorised officer of the Council or an Officer Employed by Humberside Police while the premises are open for a licensable activity</p>	
	<p><b>3. The Prevention of Crime and Disorder</b> – include a condition regarding the storage of supply of alcohol, as follows:</p>	
	<p>a. All alcohol shall be stored behind a screen so it is not accessible by persons other than staff members. All sales shall be made over the counter by a member of staff and shall be authorised by a personal licence holder.</p>	
	<p><b>4. The Prevention of Crime and Disorder and Public Safety</b> – include a condition restricting the sale of alcohol in glass receptacles, as follows:</p>	
	<p>a. Alcohol must only be supplied in sealed polycarbonate or plastic containers between 23.00 hours to 08.00 hours.</p>	
	<p><b>5. The Protection of Children From Harm</b> – In relation to the proposed Challenge 21 Condition, I would suggest that this is wholly inadequate and as such would propose the following:</p>	
	<p>a. The premises shall operate a “Challenge 30” Policy and shall only sell alcohol to persons who appear to be</p>	



	under the age of 30 on the production of either a valid DVLA driving licence, Passport, or PASS accredited ID card. The premises shall display signs stating that a Challenge 30 Policy is in force.	
	b. A record shall be maintained in a numbered paginated book of all ID checks made and all refusals.	
	<b>6. All Licensing Objectives</b> – As the premises is located within the Cumulative Impact Zone and has a history of non-compliance, the following condition is deemed appropriate to support all the licensing objectives:	
	a. A Personal Licence holder shall be working in the premises at all times when alcohol is being supplied between 23.00 hours and 08.00 hours.

Thank you for your consultation on the above application.

Britannia News and Booze is located in a mixed area of residential and commercial premises. I am concerned that the introduction of alcohol sales 24 hours a day will result in local residents being disturbed by noise from customers visiting the premises in the night time hours.

This department is of the opinion that people who have been out in the night time economy of Scunthorpe will be attracted to these premises and congregate outside at all hours of the night. Furthermore, on weekends the premises is situated within a pedestrianised zone which will result in the majority of its customers visiting the site on foot. These customers are likely to congregate outside the premises or in the vicinity on Doncaster Road causing disturbance and anti-social behaviour.

This department does not see any way that noise from customers (some of which may be intoxicated) out on the street and not under the supervision of the premises management/employees, in such close proximity to residential properties can be controlled or attenuated.

This application, if approved, will have a detrimental impact upon the local area, leading to noise disturbance, anti-social behaviour and a negative impact on residential amenity. **Being mindful of the prevention of public nuisance licensing objective, this department objects to this application.**

I write on behalf of the Chief Constable of Humberside Police. The Chief Constable objects to this application to vary the licence in respect of the above premises on the grounds that if granted the application would undermine the Prevention of Crime and Disorder and Prevention of Public Nuisance licensing objectives.

The facts that the Chief Constable relies upon in support of the objection are, in summary:

The premise presently benefit from a Premises Licence permitting the sales of alcohol between 0800 and 2300 seven days a week this application seeks to extend those hours so that the premises can trade 24 hours seven days a week.

The business is situated on Doncaster Road, Scunthorpe near to the cross roads where the High Street meets Frodingham Road, Oswald Road and Doncaster Road this junction is at the centre of the town's night time economy (NTE). This locality has a disproportionately high level of antisocial behaviour during the night and because of this presently falls within Cumulative Impact Zone.







Attached to this letter is a 3 month table showing the antisocial behaviour taking place on the street in the locality of the applicant's premises.

On the 13<sup>th</sup> November 2016 two police officers were on duty near to the applicants premises when they observed two people enter the shop then leave the premises carrying a heavy plastic bag when asked what they had purchased the officers were shown a bottle of Blossom Hill red wine and two bottles of soft drink.

Given the level of incidents the Chief Constable cannot support this application.

The Chief Constable reserves the right to serve further evidence in support of these representations and to expand upon those raised at any hearing in relation to the objection of the application.

Further to the application for the variation of a premises licence for the Britannia News & Booze received on 29 November 2016 and my representation dated 22 December 2016, as the premises is situated at the heart of the Cumulative Impact Zone and the fact that the application will have a significant impact on the said objectives, I hereby suggest the following conditions in relation to the application:

1. **The Prevention of Crime and Disorder** – include the following CCTV condition to ensure that the CCTV system is fit for purpose:

*CCTV shall be installed and maintained as follows:*

- a. *CCTV must be provided in the form of a continuous recording system providing real time pictures of evidential quality in all lighting conditions. Facial recognition must be provided for pictures of access to and egress from the premises.*
- b. *Cameras must be positioned to view all access to and egress from the premises [including fire exits] and all areas where the sale/supply of alcohol occurs.*
- c. *Recordings must be correctly time and date marked.*
- d. *Recordings must be in date order, numbered sequentially and kept for a minimum period of 31 days.*
- e. *The Premises Licence Holder must ensure an appointed member of staff is capable of downloading CCTV footage in a recordable format at all times the premises are operating.*
- f. *Recordings must be provided to officers under the direction and control of the Chief Constable of Humberside Police and employees of the Licensing Authority on request.*
- g. *The recording equipment and all media used to record data shall be kept in a secure environment under the control of the DPS or other responsible named individual.*

- h. A monitor with a minimum 15" screen must be placed in such a position so as to be viewed by staff working in the [sales / public area] of the premises and by customers.*
- i. CCTV warning signs must be displayed in public areas of the premises*
- j. An operational daily log report must be maintained endorsed by signature, indicating the system has been checked by the DPS or other responsible named individual and is compliant, in the event of any failings actions taken must be recorded.*
- k. CCTV equipment must be maintained in good working order.*

**2. The Prevention of Crime and Disorder** – include a condition requiring SIA licensed security staff, as follows:

- a. Two SIA Licensed Door Supervisors shall be employed in the premises from 23.00 hours until 08.00 hours the following day while used for any regulated activity.*
- b. SIA Licensed Door Supervisors shall not perform any other role either paid or unpaid when employed to carry out security at the premises.*
- c. All SIA Licensed Door Supervisors shall sign a register when they start work at the premises. A copy of this register shall contain their full name, date of birth, SIA licence number, SIA licence expiry date, and the name of the employing agency/door company.*
- d. This register shall be made available for inspection upon the request of an authorised officer of the Council or an Officer Employed by Humberside Police while the premises are open for a licensable activity*

**3. The Prevention of Crime and Disorder** – include a condition regarding the storage of supply of alcohol, as follows:

- a. All alcohol shall be stored behind a screen so it is not accessible by persons other than staff members. All sales shall be made over the counter by a member of staff and shall be authorised by a personal licence holder.*

**4. The Prevention of Crime and Disorder and Public Safety** – include a condition restricting the sale of alcohol in glass receptacles, as follows:

- a. Alcohol must only be supplied in sealed polycarbonate or plastic containers between 23.00 hours to 08.00 hours.*

**5. The Protection of Children From Harm** – In relation to the proposed Challenge 21 Condition, I would suggest that this is wholly inadequate and as such would propose the following:

- a. The premises shall operate a "Challenge 30" Policy and shall only sell alcohol to persons who appear to be under the age of 30 on the production of either a valid DVLA driving licence, Passport, or PASS accredited ID card. The premises shall display signs stating that a Challenge 30 Policy is in force.*
- b. A record shall be maintained in a numbered paginated book of all ID checks made and all refusals.*

6. **All Licensing Objectives** – As the premises is located within the Cumulative Impact Zone and has a history of non-compliance, the following condition is deemed appropriate to support all the licensing objectives:

- a. A Personal Licence holder shall be working in the premises at all times when alcohol is being supplied between 23.00 hours and 08.00 hours.

As previously mentioned, this premises is at the heart of the Cumulative Impact Zone. Although these conditions have been proposed I will admit that this application is a serious cause for concern. 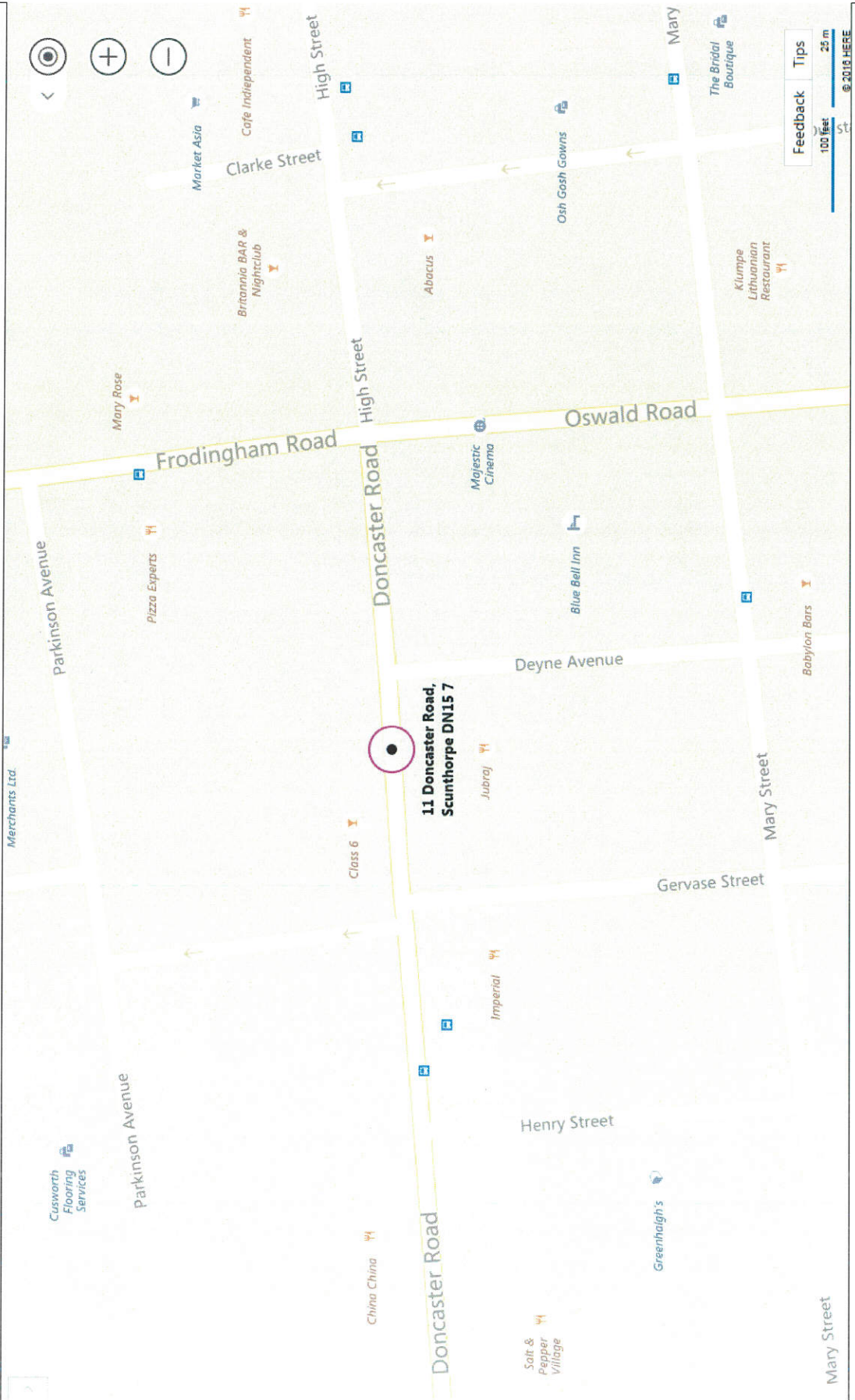

## SCHEDULE

### Mandatory Licensing Conditions

1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1—
  - (a) “duty” is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979(1);
  - (b) “permitted price” is the price found by applying the formula—

$$P=D+(D \times V)$$

where—

- (i) P is the permitted price,
  - (ii) D is the rate of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
  - (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence—
    - (i) the holder of the premises licence, the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
    - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
  - (d) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
  - (e) “valued added tax” means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994(b).
3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
  4. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day (“the first day”) would be different from the permitted price on the next day (“the second day”) as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
    - (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.
