LICENSING (ACTIVITIES) SUB-COMMITTEE

LICENSING ACT 2003 APPLICATION TO VARY A PREMISES LICENCE MESSINGHAM FARM SHOP, NORTHFIELD ROAD, MESSINGHAM

1. OBJECT AND KEY POINTS IN THIS REPORT

- 1.1 To request that the Sub-Committee determines the application to vary a Premises Licence for Messingham Farm Shop. A summary of the application is attached as Appendix A to this report and a copy of the application as Appendix B.
- 1.2 There have been 6 representations received, which have been deemed relevant. These are detailed in paragraph 4.2. Copies of the representations are attached to this report at Appendix C, D, E, F, G & H.

2. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

- 2.1 In accordance with the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003 and the council's scheme of delegation, all applications for a licence where a relevant representation has been made need to be determined by this Sub-Committee.
- 2.2 When determining the application the Sub-Committee should only consider issues which relate to the four licensing objectives. The licensing objectives are:
 - The prevention of Crime and Disorder
 - Public Safety
 - The prevention of a Public Nuisance
 - The protection of Children from Harm
- 2.3 Members of the Sub-Committee must have regard to the statutory guidance issued under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003, our Statement of Licensing Policy and our Cumulative Impact Policy if appropriate. Members of the Sub-Committee may deviate from the statutory guidance and licensing policies only if they deem that there is good reason to do so. Where Members do deviate from the statutory guidance or policies then full reasons must be provided.

- 2.4 Members of the Sub-Committee should not allow themselves to predetermine the application or to be prejudiced in favour or opposed to the licence and shall only determine the application having had an opportunity to consider all relevant facts. Members of the Sub-Committee should not hear or decide on any applications for premises licences in their own ward.
- 2.5 Members of the Sub-Committee shall remember that they are acting in a quasi-judicial role in determining the application and shall remain in the room so that they hear all the evidence before determining the application. The determination shall be based on the evidence provided, which is relevant to the licensing objectives.
- 2.6 The options available to the Sub-Committee having considered all the relevant information are as follows:
 - To refuse to vary the licence
 - To vary the licence with additional conditions
 - To vary the licence without additional conditions
 - To vary the licence but restrict the licensable activities
 - To vary the licence with restricted times
- 2.7 When considering an application to vary a licence, only the additional elements contained within the application can be considered. The activities already licensed cannot be subject to any restriction or additional conditions.
- 2.8 Members of the Sub-Committee should be advised that the applicant, responsible authorities and other persons making relevant representations may appeal to the Magistrates Court within 21 days of the date on which they were notified of the decision

3. **ISSUES FOR CONSIDERATION**

- 3.1 The application to vary a premises licence for Messingham Farm Shop was received on 8 June 2017. A summary of the application is attached at Appendix A and a copy of the application is attached at Appendix B.
- 3.2 Messingham Parish Council has objected to the application on the grounds of the prevention of public nuisance. A copy of the representation is attached at Appendix C.
- 3.3 A local resident has objected to the application on the grounds of the prevention of public nuisance. A copy of the representation is attached at Appendix D.
- 3.4 There have been 4 representations from Responsible Authorities, which have been deemed relevant. The representations are detailed in paragraph 4.2 and are attached to this report as Appendix E, F, G & H.

3.5 The applicant has been made aware of the representations.

- 4.1 A copy of an application to grant or vary a Premises Licence must be served on the responsible authorities within 48 hours of the Licensing Authority receiving its copy.

Hi Narelle/Nicola. Following is our response to your email regarding Messingham Parish Council's query as to whether any sound proofing has been put in place in our Farmshop property.

- 1. During the renovation all building regulations were strictly adhered to and subsequently passed by Building Inspectors.
- 2. All outer walls have a total thickness of 500ml inclusive of 120ml Kingspan insulation, being above the building regulations requirement.
- 3. The sloping roof/ceiling apertures have 150ml Kingspan insulation and the flat ceiling 400 ml.
- 4. The average wall thickness is 350-400ml.
- 5. All building standards were met.
- 6. The property is surrounded by an outer perimeter 6ft wall.
- 7. We have a silent run hot air vent system for heating.
- 8. All windows are double glazed and non opening.
- 9. Should on rare occasions live music be played in accordance with our licensing regulations all doors will be closed.
- 10. POLITE notices are placed at the exits requesting people exiting the premises to be quiet and respectful of the residential area. Our immediate neighbours Martin and Sue Fisher on Northfield Road and Caroline at 1 Temperance Avenue and Sharon O'Neil at No 6 have no objections. Another adjacent neighbour is a daytime beauty business.
- 11. We live on site and are very respectful to the neighbours and have a good relationship with them.

I hope this clarifies the situation. We would welcome a site visit from anyone at North Lincolnshire Council or Messingham Parish Council to view the premises so that we may answer any further queries they may have and to enable them to see the completed project.



The Application and enclosures in relation to the above mentioned premises which were received in this office on the 13 May 2017 are acknowledged and the Fire Authority make the following comment.

From the information provided the proposals with regards to Public Safety are considered acceptable to the Fire Authority.

REGULATORY REFORM (FIRE SAFETY) ORDER 2005

Fire Risk Assessment

It is a requirement that the responsible person must make a suitable and sufficient assessment of the risks to which relevant persons are exposed for the purpose of identifying the general fire precautions which are necessary to comply with the requirements and prohibitions imposed on him by or under this order and record the prescribed information

The following should be considered as essential to any such fire risk assessment:

Means of Escape

All final exit doors should be quickly and easily openable in the event of a fire without the use of a key or code.

Means of Giving Warning of Fire

The fire alarm system should conform to British Standard 5839: Part I: 2013.







Emergency Lighting

Where the normal lighting may be dimmed or turned off, a maintained or combined emergency escape lighting system should be installed. However it is not necessary for the full emergency lighting level to be provided when the normal lighting is functioning. In other premises used for recreation where there is no dimming it is necessary only for exit signs to be maintained or combined and internally illuminated.

Fire Fighting Equipment

All portable fire extinguishers should be tested and maintained in accordance with the current relevant British Standard Specification. The records of all the tests and maintenance should be available for inspection by a member of the Fire Authority.

Signage

All exits which are designated as emergency exits are to be distinctively and conspicuously marked by exit signs. The signs should comply with the current relevant British Standard or equivalent.

If you are not the responsible person for these premises, you should ensure that this letter and its contents are forwarded to that person.

If the above matters are not rectified to the satisfaction of the Fire Authority, the Fire Authority reserve the right to request a review of the Premises Licence.

If you require further advice or clarification of any of these matters, please contact the Fire Safety Inspector at the address overleaf.
