**LICENSING ACT 2003
APPLICATION TO GRANT A PREMISES LICENCE
GUNNESS VILLAGE HALL, OLD VILLAGE STREET, GUNNESS**

1. OBJECT AND KEY POINTS IN THIS REPORT

- 1.1 To request that the Sub-Committee determines the application to grant a Premises Licence for Gunness Village Hall. A summary of the application is attached as Appendix A to this report and a copy of the application as Appendix B.
- 1.2 There have been 20 representations received, which have been deemed relevant. These are detailed in paragraph 4.2. Copies of the representations are attached to this report at Appendices C to W.

2. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

- 2.1 In accordance with the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003 and the council's scheme of delegation, all applications for a licence where a relevant representation has been made need to be determined by this Sub-Committee.
- 2.2 When determining the application the Sub-Committee should only consider issues which relate to the four licensing objectives. The licensing objectives are:
 - The prevention of Crime and Disorder
 - Public Safety
 - The prevention of a Public Nuisance
 - The protection of Children from Harm
- 2.3 Members of the Sub-Committee must have regard to the statutory guidance issued under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003, our Statement of Licensing Policy and our Cumulative Impact Policy if appropriate. Members of the Sub-Committee may deviate from the statutory guidance and licensing policies only if they deem that there is good reason to do so. Where Members do deviate from the statutory guidance or policies then full reasons must be provided.

- 2.4 Members of the Sub-Committee should not allow themselves to pre-determine the application or to be prejudiced in favour or opposed to the licence and shall only determine the application having had an opportunity to consider all relevant facts. Members of the Sub-Committee should not hear or decide on any applications for premises licences in their own ward.
- 2.5 Members of the Sub-Committee shall remember that they are acting in a quasi-judicial role in determining the application and shall remain in the room so that they hear all the evidence before determining the application. The determination shall be based on the evidence provided, which is relevant to the licensing objectives.
- 2.6 The options available to the Sub-Committee having considered all the relevant information are as follows:
- To refuse to grant the licence
 - To grant the licence with additional conditions
 - To grant the licence without additional conditions
 - To grant the licence but restrict the licensable activities
 - To grant the licence with restricted times
- 2.7 Members of the Sub-Committee should be advised that the applicant, responsible authorities and other persons making relevant representations may appeal to the Magistrates Court within 21 days of the date on which they were notified of the decision

3. ISSUES FOR CONSIDERATION

- 3.1 The application to grant a premises licence for Guinness Village Hall was received on 23 October 2017. A summary of the application is attached at Appendix A and a copy of the application is attached at Appendix B.
- 3.2 Humberside Police has objected to the application on the grounds of Prevention of Crime and Disorder, Public Safety, Prevention of Public Nuisance and the Protection of Children from Harm. A copy of the representation is attached at Appendix C.
- 3.3 Environmental Health (Commercial) has objected to the application on the grounds of Prevention of Public Nuisance. A copy of the representation is attached at Appendix D.
- 3.4 Humberside Fire & Rescue find the application acceptable. A copy of the representation is attached at Appendix E.
- 3.5 Food & Safety have submitted a representation but have made no comments in relation to the application. A copy of the representation is attached at Appendix F.

3.6 There have been 17 representations from other persons, which have been deemed relevant. There are 10 who are against the application, 6 who support the application and a petition of 30 signatures who also support the application. The representations are detailed in paragraph 4.2 and are attached to this report as Appendices G to W.

3.7 The applicant has been made aware of the representations.

4. OUTCOMES OF CONSULTATION

4.1 A copy of an application to grant or vary a Premises Licence must be served on the responsible authorities within 48 hours of the Licensing Authority receiving its copy.

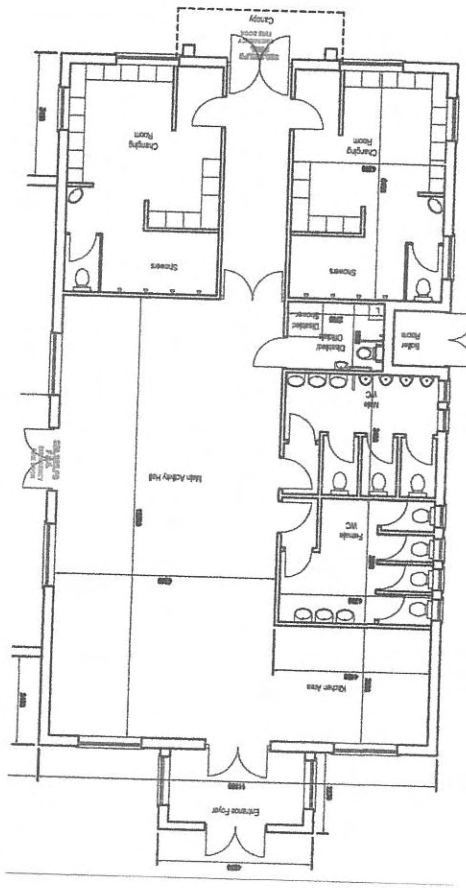

On speaking to the applicant, he is willing for the number of outdoor events to be limited to 6 events per year. This department would therefore recommend the inclusion of the following conditions:

Outdoor regulated entertainment

- **Outdoor regulated entertainment shall be limited to no more than 6 events per year.**
- **Boundary checks shall be carried out during the period of entertainment to ensure volume is not excessive.**

Indoor regulated entertainment

- **Live and recorded music shall only be held indoors other than the 6 permitted outdoor events per year.**

From the information provided the proposals with regards to Public Safety are considered **acceptable** to the Fire Authority.

REGULATORY REFORM (FIRE SAFETY) ORDER 2005

Fire Risk Assessment

It is a requirement that the responsible person must make a suitable and sufficient assessment of the risks to which relevant persons are exposed for the purpose of identifying the general fire precautions which are necessary to comply with the requirements and prohibitions imposed on him by or under this order and record the prescribed information

The following should be considered as essential to any such fire risk assessment:

Means of Escape

Exit routes must be kept clear at all material times.

All designated fire resisting doors must conform to current relevant British Standards or equivalent i.e. Fitted with a minimum of 3 fire rated hinges, intumescent heat and cold smoke seals in door edge or frame, and an approved type of self-closing device.



All final exit doors should be quickly and easily openable in the event of a fire without the use of a key or code.

Means of Giving Warning of Fire

An effective means of giving warning in case of fire that is perceptible throughout the premises and capable of being operated without exposing anyone to undue risk, is required.

Emergency Lighting

If the premises are to be used during hours of darkness, and there is insufficient borrowed lighting, a suitable emergency lighting system must be provided in those areas and their associated escape routes, including external escape routes.

Fire Fighting Equipment

Adequate measures for fire-fighting must be established. They must be identified through a process of risk assessment and must be appropriate for the size of the undertaking, the size of the premises and the nature of the activities carried out.

Signage

All exits which are designated as emergency exits are to be distinctively and conspicuously marked by exit signs. The signs should comply with the current relevant British Standard or equivalent.

Intermediate exit signs must be provided in parts of the premises at which the direction of escape would not be apparent and must include where necessary a directional arrow.

All the above requirements must be in accordance with the current relevant British Standard/Regulations or equivalent.

The premises will form part of the Fire Authority's "risk based" assessment and inspection programme and therefore the application will be held on file for reference purposes. In the meantime your attention is drawn to the publication 'Fire Safety Risk Assessment – Small and Medium Places of Assembly' which provides information for the responsible person about The Regulatory Reform (Fire Safety) Order 2005. I wish to object to this proposal on the following grounds:

1 The original planning application, item 13, states that all amplified music and entertainment shall take place within the building. As a resident backing onto the playing field and having the building only 16 meters from my rear fence I feel that any deviation from this shall affect my peace within my residential property. Loud music and noise associated with any entertainment coming from the venue especially during evening time shall disrupt me and my family's current living conditions.

2 The application to supply alcohol within the building shall only contribute to unsocial behaviour in and around the building and adjoining residential properties where a number of residents, including myself, have young children living. This I feel is completely unacceptable and feel should not be compromised. I originally purchased my property because of its location which gave me and my family relative peace and quiet. I would like to register my objections to the above application. As resident of 34 Old Village Street, Gunness DN15 8TW.

I raise the objection for the following reasons:

It is my understanding that the Gunness Village Hall Committee, who claim to hold ownership of the Village Hall, do not hold any ownership of the Playing Field, which it is believed is the property of the Parish Council.

I would question whether the application constitutes a change of use, since its initial purpose was to have been a sports type hall and when the application was put through for the building there was no mention of a licence or provision for the install of a licenced bar. We can only assume the licence will be for outside catering and bar?

There are major concerns about whether there is adequate parking for events, with the residents of Old Village Street constantly having to put up with reduced or blocked access to property due to the parking of non residents on the street and pavements during sporting events. This regularly blocks access to homes. This has NOT been alleviated by allowing use of the small parking area associated with the building.

6 It is also a concern that taxi and cars dropping people off, or collecting people early mornings, along with people talking and disturbing the peace will impact on the quiet, peaceful lifestyle of this residential area.

7 We have concerns about the general disturbance of the peace by people leaving late night events in a small residential area comprising mostly elderly people and young families most of whom who chose to live in the quiet street long before the Village Hall was built.

It is also felt it will lead to excessive littering, without any provision to rectify this.

9 Concerns also accrue to the playing of loud music late at night, encroaching on the perceived right of the residents to a peaceful, quiet lifestyle along with music and event de-rig during late night /early morning further adding to the disturbance of the peace.

This building is badged Gunness Village Hall, yet as yet there does not appear to be any facilities aimed to the residents of the village, which is well served already by two public houses. The Village is also served by an existing Hall in the form of Coleman Hall which is regularly used for Village events.

We would question the caretaking and security necessary for any planned event and whether any provision has been considered for policing of events and the surrounding areas, bearing in mind there have been several incidents of crime in the area recently.

Lastly we would question whether the size of this small building warrants the grant of licence in the nature described.

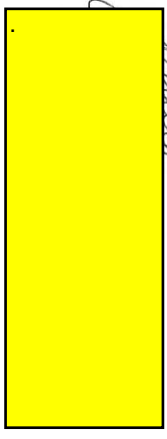

I strongly object to this application for a Premises Licence from the above organisation on the following grounds ;
Noise Nuisance ; lack of on site Car Parking ; Land that does not belong to the Village Hall Fund ; safe guarding Children.

The building in question is only phase one of the proposed village hall consisting of shower & changing facilities for use of teams etc using the sports facilities on the playing field, mainly Junior football teams, although I believe there is a small community room which was included to attract funding. A lease was granted by the Parish Council, owners of the field, to the Village Hall Fund for the footprint of the building plus disabled parking, three spaces marked out, & a turning point for emergency vehicles. No request has been made from the Village Hall Fund to the Parish Council for inclusion of the whole playing field in this Licence Application. This land is not in their ownership or control.

Inadequate parking spaces not provided, current car park again belongs to the Parish Council & is for use of persons using the field, 26 spaces. There are parking problems in Old Village Street especially at weekends when football matches are being played with vehicles blocking residents drives, parking on the footpaths not leaving space for prams etc to pass without going onto the road. This will create a noise nuisance for local residents with car doors slamming & general noise from patrons late into the night.

Quite concerned that the changing/shower/toilet facilities will be used by children from 5 years upwards from the junior football teams having to share these with persons from the bar area what practices will be put in place to ensure theirs & vulnerable adults safety. Should there be an altercation in this area from persons having to much to drink it could be quite frightening & upsetting for children to witness.

Planning Permission for this building placed many conditions as to it's use & hours of operating, these should also be included in any licence granted.

Thankyou for your reply.

I welcome the stated amendments. However the issue of late night noise etc and the effect this will have on residents sleep patterns has still not been fully addressed. I don't want to have to go to bed wearing ear plugs. Remember also that there is pensioner accommadation nearby as well as a residential care home and Gunness already has two pubs.

The new amended licensing hours do not take into account drinking up time or people milling around waiting for each other or waiting for taxis etc so whilst the finishing times are 23.00 and 24.00 the actual time people will have gone home and peace has returned to the village will be much later.

I would therefore suggest that the cut off points for music and alcohol should be 22.00 Monday to Thursday and Sunday so that everyone has gone home by 22.30 to 23.00 allowing people who have to get up early in the morning to go to work to get some sleep.

I would also suggest that the cut off point for music and alcohol should be 22.30 Friday and Saturday so that everyone has gone home by 23.00 to 23.30.

I would also suggest that a decibel meter be fitted within the hall which would cut power to the music amplifiers as the thump thump music gets gradually louder as the evening progresses.

I also think that the Gunness residents should have the right of appeal allowing any license which may be granted to be removed should adherence not be total.

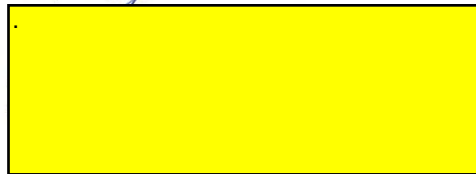
