LICENSING ACT 2003 APPLICATION TO GRANT A PREMISES LICENCE MARABOU, 240-242 FRODINGHAM ROAD, SCUNTHORPE, DN15 7JW

1. OBJECT AND KEY POINTS IN THIS REPORT

- 1.1 To request that the Sub-Committee determines the application to grant a Premises Licence for Marabou, 240-242 Frodingham Road, Scunthorpe. A summary of the application is attached as Appendix A to this report and a copy of the application as Appendix B.
- 1.2 There have been 6 representations received, which have been deemed relevant. These are detailed in paragraph 4.2. Copies of the representations are attached to this report at Appendix C, D, E, F, G & H.

2. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

- 2.1 In accordance with the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003 and the council's scheme of delegation, all applications for a licence where a relevant representation has been made need to be determined by this Sub-Committee.
- 2.2 When determining the application the Sub-Committee should only consider issues which relate to the four licensing objectives. The licensing objectives are:
 - The prevention of Crime and Disorder
 - Public Safety
 - The prevention of a Public Nuisance
 - The protection of Children from Harm
- 2.3 Members of the Sub-Committee must have regard to the statutory guidance issued under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003, our Statement of Licensing Policy and our Cumulative Impact Policy if appropriate. Members of the Sub-Committee may deviate from the statutory guidance and licensing policies only if they deem that there is good reason to do so. Where Members do deviate from the statutory guidance or policies then full reasons must be provided.

- 2.4 Members of the Sub-Committee should not allow themselves to predetermine the application or to be prejudiced in favour or opposed to the licence and shall only determine the application having had an opportunity to consider all relevant facts. Members of the Sub-Committee should not hear or decide on any applications for premises licences in their own ward.
- 2.5 Members of the Sub-Committee shall remember that they are acting in a quasi-judicial role in determining the application and shall remain in the room so that they hear all the evidence before determining the application. The determination shall be based on the evidence provided, which is relevant to the licensing objectives.
- 2.6 The options available to the Sub-Committee having considered all the relevant information are as follows:
 - To refuse to grant the licence
 - To grant the licence with additional conditions
 - To grant the licence without additional conditions
 - To grant the licence but restrict the licensable activities
 - To grant the licence with restricted times
- 2.7 Members of the Sub-Committee should be advised that the applicant, responsible authorities and other persons making relevant representations may appeal to the Magistrates Court within 21 days of the date on which they were notified of the decision.

3. ISSUES FOR CONSIDERATION

- 3.1 The application to grant a premises licence for Marabou, 240-242 Frodingham Road, Scunthorpe was received on 8 August 2018. A summary of the application is attached at Appendix A and a copy of the application is attached at Appendix B.
- 3.2 Trading Standards have objected to the application on the grounds of prevention of crime & disorder, public safety, prevention of public nuisance and protection of children from harm. A copy of the representation is attached at Appendix C.
- 3.3 There have been 5 representations from other persons, which have been deemed relevant. The representations are detailed in paragraph 4.2 and are attached to this report as Appendix D, E ,F, G & H.
- 3.4 The applicant has been made aware of the representations.

Staff training with regard to age restricted sales of alcohol shall take place upon commencement of employment and thereafter, at least every six months.

The Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) or duly appointed key member of staff, shall maintain a record of all training, with details of the date, names of the staff, the person providing the training and its contents, which shall be completed at the time of the training. The records must be made available to a representative of any responsible authority on request.

The premises shall operate a "Challenge 25" policy and shall display notices on the premises to bring it to customer's attention.

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
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

The Prevention of Crime and Disorder

CCTV shall be installed and maintained as follows:

CCTV must be provided in the form of a continuous recording system providing real time pictures of evidential quality in all lighting conditions. Facial recognition must be provided for pictures of access to and egress from the premises.

Cameras must be positioned to view all access to and egress from the premises, including fire exits; and all areas where the sale/supply of alcohol occurs

Cameras must be positioned to view all areas not clearly seen from the counter, including outside areas where it is intended to conduct licensable activities.

Recordings must be correctly time and date marked.

Recordings must be in date order, numbered sequentially and kept for a minimum period of 31 days covering all trading periods conducted at the premises.

All recordings will be maintained to the standard of evidential quality.

The Premises Licence Holder must ensure an appointed member of staff is capable of downloading CCTV footage and producing copies on site at all times when the premises are operating.

Recordings, or copies of recordings must be provided to Officers under the direction and control of the Chief Constable of Humberside Police and Authorised Officers of the Licensing Authority on request.

The recording equipment and all media used to record data shall be kept in a secure environment under the control of the DPS or other responsible named individual.

A monitor with a minimum 15" screen must be placed in such a position so as to be viewed by staff working in the sales area of the premises and by customers.

CCTV warning signs must be displayed in public areas of the premises.

CCTV equipment must be maintained in good working order.

An operational weekly log report must be maintained endorsed by the DPS or other responsibles maintained named individual and is compliant, in the event of any failings, actions taken must be recorded.

All records must be provided to Officers under the direction and control of the Chief Constable of Humberside Police and Authorised Officers of the Licensing Authority on request.

An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and be made available on request to an authorised officer of the Council or a police licensing officer, this log will record the following:

- a) all crimes/incidents reported to the venue
- b) all complaints received
- c) any refusal of the sale of alcohol
- d) any incidents of disorder
- e) all visits by a relevant authority or emergency service
- f) any defect with the CCTV system

All spirits sold at the premises shall be handed to customers by staff from either a secure cabinet or shelving from a location that customers do not have access to.

I object to the application on the following grounds:

Objection:

There are already more than enough shops selling alcohol on this road and with the current flow of cheap alcohol on sale it is beyond control and only getting worse. The streets are a mess littered with beer cans and crime is on the rise. Giving this shop permission to sell alcohol is a step in the wrong direction and it goes against everything the local council wards are trying to do. We as residents already suffer from noise disturbances and anti social behaviour so I urge the committee to refuse this application.

Dear Licensing Department,

This is an objection in reference to the new application made by Marabous Supermarket, 240-242 Frodingham Road, DN15 7NW to sell alcohol between the hours of 7am to midnight, Sunday to Saturday (7 days a week).

In discussions already raised by local residents we would like to raise the following concerns by way of formal objection.

1. Concentration of Licensed Outlets.

- There are 3 public houses on the residential side of Frodingham Road,
 all in close proximity to the proposed site.
- There are 16 shops on Frodingham Road. Certainly a lot more then is needed.
- In addition to above there are numerous restaurants with alcohol licences.

The addition of another outlet selling alcohol in this location, which is a residential area and bounded by the local Church Hall and Sikh Temple which host weekly regular young children's events and gatherings, is just not required. Also having another off licence is inappropriate during daylight hours and after dark adds to concerns about breaches of the peace increasing in and around the area.

2. <u>Crime and Disorder.</u>

Another alcohol licence premises will draw unwelcome attention and increased footfall at unsociable hours to a residential area.

- Noise, public nuisance, anti-social behaviour, low-level nuisance (non reportable crime inc. shouting, swearing, urination in public, littering) will be increased.
- Historically there have been incidents of regular gatherings of groups drinking alcohol and causing disturbances. Police attention to this issue has largely cured this, however, the area is acknowledged by the Police to be of concern.
- Recently there have been incidents of drunk and disorderly behaviour of alcohol incidents, illustrating the reality of the Police and local residents' concerns.

3. <u>Public Nuisance.</u>

- Opening until late in a quiet, residential area, will unnecessarily draw people from a wider area at unsociable hours.
- Noise, light pollution, traffic and traffic noise will all have a negative impact. To note again, this is a residential area.
- Additional traffic, to an already busy road will have serious public safety implications.
- I hope by looking at these points you seriously consider these objections and do the right thing for the local residents & community.

Dear Sir/Madam

I am writing to register that I strongly object to the application for a premises licence at Marabous Supermarket, 240-242 Frodingham Road, Scunthorpe DN15 7NW. The basis for this opposition is that granting a licence for these premises will not promote the licensing objectives, particularly the prevention of crime, disorder and antisocial behaviour.

240-242 Frodingham Road lies within the Council's Cumulative Impact Area, and enabling the premises to sell alcohol would be totally detrimental to its aims and objectives. The application proposes that alcohol will be sold for consumption off the premises between 06:00am to 00.00 hours, seven days a week. Granting a licence would provide a further source of alcohol within an area already so heavily populated with licensed premises that crime, disorder and public nuisance have already reached problem levels for the local police.

This is a residential area and residents in this area already suffer noise nuisance and antisocial behaviour at all hours of the day and night. They have endured this inconvenience since 2003 when the licensing legislation was first amended, and it is totally unacceptable to expect them to continue to do so.
