INFORMATION TO ACCOMPANY NOTICE OF HEARING

In the interests of timely, efficient and cost effective decision making the Authority strongly urges all parties involved in any hearing to ensure that they provide advance disclosure between the parties of any information on which they intend to rely at any hearing. Failure to do so may lead to discussions over the admissibility of such information and/or the adjournment of the hearing.

1. Right of Attendance

A party attending the hearing may be assisted or represented by any person whether or not that person is legally qualified.

2. Representations and Supporting Information

- 2.1 A party at the hearing shall be entitled to
 - a) give further information in response to the points raised (if any) under point 5 of this information. Any documents upon which you intend to rely should be served with the Counter-notice¹
 - b) address the authority, and
 - c) if given permission by the authority, question any other party.
- 2.2 A party who wishes to withdraw any representations they have made may do so
 - a) by giving notice to the Authority no later than 24 hours before the day or the first day on which the hearing is to be held, or
 - b) orally at the hearing

3. Failure to attend the Hearing

- a) Where a Party informs the Authority that they do not intend to attend the hearing, then the hearing may proceed in their absence.
- b) Where a party has not so indicated and fails to attend or be represented at the hearing the Authority may
 - (i) where it considers it to be necessary in the public interest, adjourn the hearing to a specified date, or
 - (ii) hold the hearing in the party's absence.
- where the Authority holds the hearing in the absence of a party, the authority shall consider at the hearing the application, representations or notice made by that party.

5. Points upon which the authority requires clarification

If the Local Authority wish you to clarify certain points/issues arising from your application/objection this will be indicated under point 7 of the Committee Report.

6. Powers to extend time limits/adjourn the hearing

- a) The relevant parties must notify the Authority if they consider that the time limits set out in the procedure of hearing will not be sufficient.
- b) The Authority may extend the time limits if it believes that it shall be in the public interest to do so and shall forthwith give notice to the parties stating the period of the extension and the reason for it.
- c) The Authority may adjourn a hearing to a specified date or arrange for a hearing to be held on specified additional dates where it considers this to be necessary for its consideration of any representations or notice made by a party.
- d) Where the Authority adjourns the hearing to a specified date or additional dates, the parties must be notified forthwith of the date, time and place to which the hearing has been adjourned.

7. Right to dispense with hearing if all parties agree

- (1) The Authority may dispense with holding a hearing if all relevant persons agree that such a hearing is unnecessary and that they have given notice to the Authority that they consider a hearing to be unnecessary.
- (2) Where all relevant persons agree that a hearing is unnecessary and have given notice of this then the Authority shall forthwith give notice to all parties that the hearing has been dispensed with.

8. Hearing to be in public

- 8.1 The hearing shall place in public, however;
- 8.2 The licensing authority may exclude the public from all or part of a hearing where it considers that the public interest in so doing outweighs the public interest in the hearing, or that part of the hearing, taking place in public.
- 8.3 For these purposes a party and any person assisting or representing a party may be treated as a member of the public.

9. Disruptive behaviour

The authority may require any person attending the hearing who in their opinion is behaving in a disruptive manner to leave the hearing and may-

- (a) refuse to permit that person to return, or
- (b) permit him to return only on such conditions as the authority may specify, but such person may, before the end of the hearing, submit to the authority in writing any information, which they would have been entitled to give orally had they not been required to leave.

10. Record of proceedings

The authority shall provide for a record to be taken of the hearing in a permanent and intelligible form and kept for six years from the date of the determination or, where an appeal is brought against the determination of the authority, the disposal of the appeal. NB^4

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⁴ It is the Councils policy to tape record the proceedings of the Licensing sub-committee. Only the open part of the hearing shall be recorded. The tape recording shall then be kept in a secure environment.

1. OBJECT AND KEY POINTS IN THIS REPORT

- 1.1 To request that the Sub-Committee determines the application to grant a Premises Licence for Viking Market, Frodingham Plaza. A summary of the application is attached as Appendix A to this report and a copy of the application as Appendix B.
- 1.2 There have been twenty-eight representations received, which have been deemed relevant. These are detailed in paragraph 4.2. Copies of the representations are attached to this report at Appendices D to J.

2. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

- 2.1 In accordance with the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003 and North Lincolnshire Council's scheme of delegation, all applications for a licence where a relevant representation has been made need to be determined by this Sub-Committee.
- 2.2 When determining the application, the Sub-Committee should only consider issues which relate to the four Licensing Objectives, as stipulated by the Act. The Licensing Objectives are:
 - The Prevention of Crime and Disorder
 - Public Safety
 - The Prevention of Public Nuisance
 - The Protection of Children from Harm
- 2.3 Members of the Sub-Committee must have regard to the Statutory Guidance issued under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003, our Statement of Licensing Policy and our Cumulative Impact Policy. Members of the Sub-Committee may deviate from the Statutory Guidance and Licensing Policies only if they deem that there is good reason to do so. Where Members do deviate from the Statutory Guidance or Policy, full reasons must be provided.

- 2.4 Members of the Sub-Committee should not allow themselves to predetermine the application or to be prejudiced in favour or opposed to the licence and shall only determine the application having had an opportunity to consider all relevant facts. Members of the Sub-Committee should not hear or decide on any applications for premises licences in their own Ward.
- 2.5 Members of the Sub-Committee shall remember that they are acting in a quasi-judicial role in determining the application and shall remain in the room so that they hear all the evidence before determining the application. The determination shall be based on the evidence provided, which is relevant to the Licensing Objectives.
- 2.6 The options available to the Sub-Committee having considered all the relevant information are as follows:
 - To refuse to grant the licence
 - To grant the licence with additional conditions
 - To grant the licence without additional conditions
 - To grant the licence but restrict the licensable activities
 - To grant the licence with restricted times
- 2.7 Members of the Sub-Committee should be advised that the applicant, responsible authorities and other persons making relevant representations may appeal to the Magistrates Court within 21 days of the date on which they were notified of the decision.

3. ISSUES FOR CONSIDERATION

- 3.1 The application to grant a Premises Licence for Viking Market, Frodingham Plaza, was received on 3 February 2022. A summary of the application is attached at Appendix A and a copy of the application and plan are attached at Appendices B and C.

Humberside Police have made a representation in relation to the application for the grant of a premises licence.

The representation is made on the grounds of:

- The Prevention of Crime and Disorder
- The Prevention of a Public Nuisance
- The Protection of Children from Harm

Humberside Police suggested that the following conditions should be added to any granted premises licence.

12 **Police Conditions – General**

Staff training shall be given to all staff working at the premises. Such training shall be documented and recorded in a book or folder kept solely for that purpose. It shall record the date and names of those trained and the person providing it. All present shall sign the book. The frequency of the training shall be once every six months. The training shall cover all aspects of the responsible sale of alcohol (Licensing objectives, age verification, how to detect proxy sales, consequences of underage sales, serving to drunks and street drinkers etc) and conflict management. The book shall be available to be viewed on demand by a person under the direction and control of the Chief Constable or an officer of North Lincolnshire Council.

Police Conditions – The Prevention of Crime and Disorder

- 1. Any CCTV system shall need to be registered in accordance with the Data Protection Act, and warning signs displayed in public areas of the premises.
- There shall be sufficient cameras to cover those areas that are not easily supervised from the sales counter.
- A monitor should be placed in such a position so as to be viewed by staff working in the sales area of the premises.
- 4. The system must be capable of continuously recording in colour, providing real time pictures of evidential quality in all lighting conditions, and copies of such recordings shall be retained for a period of not less than 28 days.
- 5. Any system installed should be capable of producing copies of recordings on site.
- Copies of recordings shall be provided on request to a person under the direction and control of the Chief Constable or an officer of North Lincolnshire Council on DVD/USB at no cost.
- 7. The designated premises supervisor will be responsible for the operation of the system and shall ensure that it is maintained in accordance with these codes of practice.

- 8. The Premises Licence Holder must ensure an appointed member of staff is capable of downloading CCTV footage in a recordable format at all times the premises are operating.
- 9. Records of maintenance of the CCTV system shall be kept by the person responsible and the system shall be maintained in working order and checked weekly. Records of any maintenance and weekly checks shall be endorsed by signature by the DPS or other responsible named individual, and actions taken must be recorded. The record shall be produced on request to a person under the direction and control of the Chief Constable or an officer of the local authority on production of their identification.
- 10. Cameras must be positioned to view all access to and egress from the premises (including fire exits) and all areas where the sale of alcohol occurs.
- 11. Recordings shall be made of each trading period conducted at the premises, and must be correctly time and date marked.
- 12. CCTV camera views are not to be obstructed.
- 13. Signs alerting customers that CCTV is in operation must be displayed

An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request to a person under the direction and control of the Chief Constable or an officer of North Lincolnshire Council, which will record the following:

- all crimes reported to the venue
- any complaints received
- any incidents of disorder
- any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service
- any faults in the CCTV system or searching equipment or scanning equipment

A log shall be kept detailing all refused sales of alcohol. The log should include the date and time of the refused sale and the name of the member of staff who refused the sale. The book will be available to be viewed on demand by either an officer of the Local Authority or an officer under the direction and control of the Chief Constable at all times whilst the premises are open.

Staff training with regard to age restricted sales shall take place upon commencement of employment and thereafter, at least every six months.

The Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) or duly appointed key member of staff, shall maintain a record of all training, with details of the date, names of the staff, the person providing the training and its contents, which shall be completed and signed by all at the time of the training. The records must be made available upon request by an authorised officer of North Lincolnshire Council or the Police.

A 'Challenge 21' or 'Challenge 25' policy shall be in place and brought to the customer's attention by way of posters on the premises.

Anyone who appears to be under the age of 21 or under 25 (depending upon the policy) shall be asked to produce a valid, recognised photographic proof of age document. Acceptable forms of identification shall be a passport, photo card driving licence or 'PASS' approved and hologrammed identification.

A refusals book or electronic log shall be kept at the premises and shall be used to record all refusals to sell age restricted products for any reason. The details to be recorded must be as follows:

- Date & time of refusal
- Item refused and reason for refusal
- Name & address of customer (if given)
- Description of customer
- Details of ID offered (if shown)

The refusals book shall be regularly audited by the DPS or duly appointed key member of staff to assess employees'

I have provided photographic evidence in relation to alcohol fuelled anti-	

social behaviour. Granting of this licence will further encourage excess litter and increased anti-social behaviour".

"The vicinity of the premises in question is surrounded by residential properties, supplementary schools, places of worship and family-owned businesses whereby children frequently pass by either on their own or with their responsible adult or family members".

23 Conditions Proposed by Local Residents

The local residents suggested that the following conditions should be added to any granted premises licence.

- 1. "Restricted Sale Times no sale of alcohol between the hours of 14:00-20:00hrs Monday to Friday and between the hours of 12pm-19:00hrs Saturday and Sunday. The hours recommended are peak times for children returning from school who live in the vicinity, for supplementary classes taking place in the vicinity and peak time hours over the weekend for families to shop and socialise with family and friends. This will also help businesses to entice new clients to the area."
- 2. "Challenge Everyone Scheme ID to be shown by everyone purchasing alcohol from the premises"
- 3. "Mandatory Security Guard Located on the front door of the premises to disperse groups in and around the vicinity of the premises. The recommended area has been mapped as below (attached to this email)".
- 4. "Daily Cleaners we recommend the business is responsible for ensuring the immediate surrounding area is free from bottles, cans and general littering and suggest they frequently clean this area. There is a direct correlation between the discarded bottles and the purchase of the same".
- 5. "Posters Located inside and outside the store in different languages informing anyone who purchases alcohol and is found to be drinking in the vicinity or discarding the bottles in the vicinity, will be barred from purchasing further alcohol".
- 6. "Barred list Premise to have a refusal/barred book on site, recording details of anyone who has been refused alcohol."
- 7. "Recycling Install a glass bottle/can recycling bins outside and in and around the premises".
- 8. "Always Present As this is a Cumulative Impact Zone, we recommend that the personal licence holder and dedicated premises supervisor to be always present on the premises when alcohol is sold or supplied".

24 Appendix J – Mr Abid Khan

Mr Khan has submitted a representation on the grounds of all four Licensing Objectives.

"It is argued that the granting of this licence will encourage existing litter and an increase of the anti-social behaviour, which the police are aware of and are currently exhausting all channels to prevent and tackle this."

"The application does not promote the public safety aspects of the licensing objectives as the area already has issues with people gathering under the influence of alcohol. A matter the local police team are already aware of and trying to tackle. The sale of alcohol in this area has increased which is argued has contributed to all the above issues. Another premises the size of Viking Market will further exacerbate the problems in the area".

"The application will not prevent public nuisance as mentioned prior matters have only got worse. Having access to another premise that may sell alcohol could lead to further nuisance and encourage anti-social behaviour".

The application could contribute to exposing children to alcohol causing harm. It is known that several premises on Frodingham Road could have been prosecuted for the sale of illegal cigarettes and alcohol as well as selling to underage young people. The area is already a hot spot for child criminal and sexual exploitation and additional sells of alcohol and adults under the influence of alcohol increases the risks to children and young people".

"I would like to suggest that if a licence was granted, conditions such as security guard within the shop or restricted sales of alcohol be applied".



In respect of the application by Frodingham Plaza, Smith Street, Scunthorpe. I have attended and spoken with the applicant. Humberside Police are not satisfied that the licensing objectives will be sufficiently upheld unless changes are made to the operating schedule and due to this Humberside Police will be objecting to the application with the Licensing Authority. Humberside Police make the following representations to be added to the operating schedule in order to put sufficient controls in place to uphold the licensing objectives.

Licensing objectives not up held:

<u>The prevention of crime of disorder</u>: regards to CCTV conditions are not sufficient on the application. The recording of incidents expanded. Staff training.

The protection of children from harm: regards to the challenge 25 and for sales and staff training

<u>Prevention of Public Nuisance:</u> regards to ABV for beer, cider & lagers being set to 5.6% and only to be sold in packs of 4. Spirits to sold in in no container below 50cl as in a CIZ and PSPO area.

The following amendments have been discussed in full and agreed directly with the applicant (please see below):

CCTV

- 1. Any CCTV system shall need to be registered in accordance with the Data Protection Act, and warning signs displayed in public areas of the premises.
- 2. There shall be sufficient cameras to cover those areas that are not easily supervised from the sales counter.
- 3. A monitor should be placed in such a position so as to be viewed by staff working in the sales area of the premises.
- 4. The system must be capable of continuously recording in colour, providing real time pictures of evidential quality in all lighting conditions, and copies of such recordings shall be retained for a period of not less than 28 days.
- Any system installed should be capable of producing copies of recordings on site.
- 6. Copies of recordings shall be provided on request to a person under the direction and control of the Chief Constable or an officer of North Lincolnshire Council on DVD/USB at no cost.
- 7. The designated premises supervisor will be responsible for the operation of the system and shall ensure that it is maintained in accordance with these codes of practice.
- 8. The Premises Licence Holder must ensure an appointed member of staff is capable of downloading CCTV footage in a recordable format at all times the premises are operating.
- 10. Records of maintenance of the CCTV system shall be kept by the person responsible and the system shall be maintained in working order and checked weekly. Records of any maintenance and weekly checks shall be endorsed by signature by the DPS or other responsible named individual, and actions taken must be recorded. The record shall be produced on request to a person under the direction and control of the Chief Constable or an officer of the local authority on production of their identification.
- 11. Cameras must be positioned to view all access to and egress from the premises (including fire exits) and all areas where the sale of alcohol occurs.
- 12. Recordings shall be made of each trading period conducted at the premises, and must be correctly time and date marked.
- 13. CCTV camera views are not to be obstructed.
- Signs alerting customers that CCTV is in operation must be displayed

- An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request to a person under the direction and control of the Chief Constable or an officer of North Lincolnshire Council, which will record the following:
- all crimes reported to the venue
- any complaints received
- any incidents of disorder
- any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service
- any faults in the CCTV system or searching equipment or scanning equipment
- A log shall be kept detailing all refused sales of alcohol. The log should include the date and time of the refused sale and the name of the member of staff who refused the sale. The book will be available to be viewed on demand by either an officer of the Local Authority or an officer under the direction and control of the Chief Constable at all times whilst the premises are open.

Challenge 25 & Training

- Challenge 25 shall be implemented and a proof of age policy is to be applied with the accepted means of proof of age being:
- Passport
- Photo Driving Licence
- A recognised valid photo-id card bearing the PASS hologram
- any future accredited and accepted proof of age, as defined by Humberside Police
 Signs shall be displayed stating that the premises operates a Challenge 25 Policy.
- Staff training shall be given to all staff working at the premises. Such training shall be documented and recorded in a book or folder kept solely for that purpose. It shall record the date and names of those trained and the person providing it. All present shall sign the book. The frequency of the training shall be once every six months. The training shall cover all aspects of the responsible sale of alcohol (Licensing objectives, age verification, how to detect proxy sales, consequences of underage sales, serving to drunks and street drinkers etc) and conflict management. The book shall be available to be viewed on demand by a person under the direction and control of the Chief Constable or an officer of North Lincolnshire Council.

ABV/SPIRITS

The premise shall not display, offer, or sell any beers, lagers or ciders with an ABV in excess of 5.6%. All beer, lager and cider displayed for sale in cans shall only be sold in minimum packs of 4 cans, there shall be no sales of individual cans of beer, lager or cider.

Alcohol spirits with an ABV (Alcohol by volume) above 20% shall only be displayed, offered or sold in bottles no less than 50cl. These spirits shall only be displayed for sale behind the sales counter or other approved secure display.

If the application is amended to include the representations made above in the operating schedule Humberside Police will remove its objection.

Whilst the applicant offers some steps in relation to promoting the 4 licensing objectives, it is not felt that these steps are detailed enough and as such, Trading Standards object to the application on the grounds of the Prevention of Crime and Disorder and the Protection of Children from Harm licensing objectives.

Trading Standards will remove the objection if the following conditions are agreed by the applicant. Should Humberside Police agree conditions with the applicant in relation to CCTV systems, Trading Standards accept that those conditions will take precedence:

The Prevention of Crime and Disorder:

- 1. A CCTV system shall be installed on the premises.
- 2. CCTV warning signs shall be displayed in public areas of the premises.
- 3. There shall be sufficient cameras to cover those areas that are not easily supervised from the sales counter, both inside and outside of the premises, and all areas where the sale of alcohol occurs.
- 4. A monitor should be placed in such a position so as to be viewed by staff working in the sales area of the premises.
- 5. Recordings must be made of each trading period conducted at the premises and must be correctly time and date marked. The system must be capable of

- continuously recording in colour, providing real time pictures of evidential quality in all lighting conditions, and copies of such recordings shall be retained for a period of not less than 28 days.
- 6. Any system installed should be capable of producing copies of recordings on site. Copies of recordings shall be provided on request to an authorised officer of North Lincolnshire Council or the Police at no cost.
- 7. The designated premises supervisor (DPS) shall be responsible for the operation of the system and shall ensure that it is maintained in accordance with approved codes of practice and must ensure an appointed member of staff is capable of downloading CCTV footage in a recordable format at all times when the premises are operating.
- 8. The system shall be maintained in working order and checked weekly. Records of maintenance of the CCTV system shall be kept by the DPS and shall be provided on request to an authorised officer of North Lincolnshire Council or the Police at no cost.

The Protection of Children from Harm:

- 1. Staff training with regard to age restricted sales shall take place upon commencement of employment and thereafter, at least every six months.
- 2. The Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) or duly appointed key member of staff, shall maintain a record of all training, with details of the date, names of the staff, the person providing the training and its contents, which shall be completed and signed by all at the time of the training. The records must be made available upon request by an authorised officer of North Lincolnshire Council or the Police.
- 3. A 'Challenge 21' or 'Challenge 25' policy shall be in place and brought to the customer's attention by way of posters on the premises.
- 4. Anyone who appears to be under the age of 21 or under 25 (depending upon the policy) shall be asked to produce a valid, recognised photographic proof of age document. Acceptable forms of identification shall be a passport, photo card driving licence or 'PASS' approved and hologrammed identification.
- 5. A refusals book or electronic log shall be kept at the premises and shall be used to record all refusals to sell age restricted products for any reason. The details to be recorded must be as follows:
 - 1. Date & time of refusal
 - 2. Item refused and reason for refusal
 - 3. Name & address of customer (if given)
 - 4. Description of customer
 - 5. Details of ID offered (if shown)

The refusals book shall be regularly audited by the DPS or duly appointed key member of staff to assess employees' compliance with refusing age-restricted sales and must be made available upon request by an authorised officer of North Lincolnshire Council or the Police.



Exit routes must be kept clear at all material times.







Means of Giving Warning of Fire

The fire alarm system should conform to British Standard 5839: Part I: 2017 or equivalent.

Emergency Lighting

The emergency lighting system when installed should comply with BS5266 part 1:2016

Fire Fighting Equipment

Adequate measures for fire-fighting must be established. They must be identified through a process of risk assessment and must be appropriate for the size of the undertaking, the size of the premises and the nature of the activities carried out.

<u>Signage</u>

All exits are to be distinctively and conspicuously marked by exit notices. The notices should comply with the current British Standard.

Intermediate notices should be provided in parts of the premises at which the direction of escape would not be apparent and should include where necessary a directional arrow.

We are writing in our capacity as the elected members for Town Ward in relation to this Application for a Premises Licence – Grant made by Multi-Culti Foods Limited at the above address.

This area of the Town Ward has particularly high levels of deprivation which makes some residents vulnerable to the attraction of cheap alcohol which can lead to various anti-social behaviours.

Having looked at the applicant's proposed operating schedule, it seems to us that it fails to address the listed objectives. Specifically, assurance relating to prevention of crime and disorder, protection of children from harm, and public safety, do not appear to have been adequately addressed and we would be looking for a more robust application from the applicant.

We have, on many occasions, seen apparently underage people, with cheap alcoholic drinks, congregating outside the Mosque on Percival Street which is only a few metres from this proposed shopping plaza. This is both a public safety issue and potentially a child protection issue.


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There have also been many complaints received from residents regarding the amount of litter and dumped waste left by customers of the shops in the area. On site visits we, as elected members, witness huge amounts of litter including bottles and cans in the near vicinity of Frodingham Plaza. We continue to receive numerous emails and telephone calls every week about fly tipping and excessive litter in this area.

Also, the planned opening hours are, in our view, excessive. The 'footprint' of the premises extends to the area outside the shop and, we consider that, both the built-up premises and the footprint around it should be supervised - a security guard would be helpful.


Overall, we consider that another licensed premises is one too many in an area already beyond saturation point in terms of retail outlets selling alcohol. However, if the license is granted we urge that attention be given to ensure that the plaza has robust measures in place to tackle potential anti-social behaviour and crime around their premises.

I would like to take this opportunity to voice my concerns regarding an application for the aforementioned premises.

I regrettably inform you that I have grave concerns on this application. The premises in question is in an area that has been designated as a **Cumulative Impact Zone (CIZ)** which, according to the North Lincolnshire Council's Cumulative Impact Policy Licensing Act 2003, "...is already of concern to the Licensing Authority and the statutory authorities, as there are high levels of alcohol fuelled crime and disorder."

As you are acting as the Licensing Authority, I am aware you have a duty to comply with the obligations under Section 17 of the Crime and Disorder Act 1998 and the Licensing Act 2003, in respect to crime and disorder and to promote the four licensing objectives.

I believe that granting of this application will not promote the four licensing objectives, and believe the area, residents and visitors will experience the following:

Objecting on the grounds of the prevention of crime and disorder.

The area in and around Frodingham Road is already suffering from the excess sale of alcohol extensively available with the existing off licence premises within the vicinity. As a local resident, a congregation member of Scunthorpe Central Mosque and who visits shops on Frodingham Road, I have at first hand seen the increase of alcohol fuelled littering, disturbances, intimidation, and lewd sexual acts which have been reported to the police and added to this representation as evidence. I have provided photographic evidence in relation to alcohol fuelled anti-social behaviour.

Granting of this licence will further encourage excess litter and increased anti-social behaviour. The application will not discourage crime and disorder and would encourage more negative attention, especially if the premises sells alcohol. In addition, please find a link to our resident's portal where further evidence of anti-social behaviour due to alcohol fuelled issues are posted which covers the CIZ.

2. Objecting on the grounds of public safety

The application does not promote public safety as the area is already suffering from the effects of alcohol fuelled anti-social behaviour. The intimidation of drinkers in large groups covering the public footpath, smashed alcohol bottles and alcohol fuelled issues.

A monitoring form had been submitted to the police with descriptions and added as evidence to this complaint. Picture evidence has also been attached to this representation.

As stated above, the previous link provides further evidence of anti-social behaviour due to alcohol fuelled issues are posted which covers the CIZ.

3. Objecting on the grounds of public nuisance

The granting of the application will not prevent public nuisance as the level of broken bottles, threats to community safety, noise and odour has only increased in and around the premises. Picture evidence submitted with this representation shows not only litter, but broken glass bottles in proximity of the premises. This will increase and will increase the threat of harm to the residents and those who are vulnerable due to broken glass bottles on the public footpaths and roads.

There are evidence of individuals urinating close to buildings attended by residents and children which affects their standard of living.

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As stated above, the previous link provides further evidence of anti-social behaviour due to alcohol fuelled issues are posted which covers the CIZ.

4. Objecting on the grounds of protection of children from harm

The application will contribute to further exposing children to immoral and psychological harm examples include early exposure to strong language, sexual expletives, drinking alcohol and violence. The vicinity of the premises in question is surrounded by residential properties, supplementary schools, places of worship and family-owned businesses whereby children frequently pass by either on their own or with their responsible adult or family members.

Evidence included shows empty/broken glass bottles close to a place of worship where supplementary classes for children take place.

Evidence included also shows groups drinking close to these venues at times where children are returning from school, attending other types of learning, attending places of worship or shopping with parents.

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As stated above, the previous link provides further evidence of anti-social behaviour due to alcohol is posted which covers the CIZ.

I am aware that the introduction of the Licensing Act 2003 removed the 'need' argument from licensing. In the case that this application is granted, I would like to recommend the following Licence conditions on this application that will support the four licensing objectives:

- Restricted Sale Times No sale of alcohol between the hours of 14:00-20:00 Mon-Fri and between the hours of 12pm -19:00 Saturday and Sunday. The hours recommended are peak times for children returning from school who live in the vicinity, for supplementary classes taking place in the vicinity and peak time hours over the weekend for families to shop and socialise with family and friends. This will also help businesses to entice new clients to the
- 2. **Challenge Everyone Scheme** ID to be shown by everyone purchasing alcohol from the premises.
- Mandatory Security Guard Located on the front door of the premises to disperse groups in and around the vicinity of the premises. The recommended area has been mapped as below:



- 4. Daily Cleaners we recommend the business is responsible for ensuring the immediate surrounding area is free from bottles, cans and general littering and suggest they frequently clean this area. There is a direct correlation between the discarded bottles and the purchase of the same.
- 5. **Posters** Located inside and outside the store in different languages informing anyone who purchases alcohol and is found drinking in the vicinity or discarding the bottles in the vicinity, will be barred from purchasing any further alcohol.
- 6. **Barred list** Premise to have a refusal/barred book on site, recording details of everyone who has been refused alcohol
- 7. Recycling Install a glass bottle/ can recycling and recycling bins outside and in and around the premises.
- 8. Always Present As this is a Cumulative Impact Zone, we recommend that the personal licence holder and Dedicated Premises Supervisor to be always present on the premises when alcohol is sold or supplied.

I fully understand that this Representation will be made available to the applicant and included in the Sub Committee's Hearing papers which are publicly accessible documents, and any subsequent appeal court proceedings.

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Evidence included shows empty/broken glass bottles close to a place of worship where supplementary classes for children take place.

Evidence included also shows groups drinking close to these venues at times where children are returning from school, attending other types of learning, attending places of worship or shopping with parents.

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- Restricted Sale Times No sale of alcohol between the hours of 14:00-20:00 Mon-Fri and between the hours of 12pm -19:00 Saturday and Sunday. The hours recommended are peak times for children returning from school who live in the vicinity, for supplementary classes taking place in the vicinity and peak time hours over the weekend for families to shop and socialise with family and friends. This will also help businesses to entice new clients to the area.
- 2. **Challenge Everyone Scheme** ID to be shown by everyone purchasing alcohol from the premises.
- 3. Mandatory Security Guard Located on the front door of the premises to disperse groups in and around the vicinity of the premises. The recommended area has been mapped as below:



- 4. Daily Cleaners we recommend the business is responsible for ensuring the immediate surrounding area is free from bottles, cans and general littering and suggest they frequently clean this area. There is a direct correlation between the discarded bottles and the purchase of the same.
- 5. **Posters** Located inside and outside the store in different languages informing anyone who purchases alcohol and is found drinking in the vicinity or discarding the bottles in the vicinity, will be barred from purchasing any further alcohol.
- 6. Barred list Premise to have a refusal/barred book on site, recording details of everyone who has been refused alcohol
- 7. Recycling Install a glass bottle/ can recycling and recycling bins outside and in and around the premises.
- 8. Always Present As this is a Cumulative Impact Zone, we recommend that the personal licence holder and Dedicated Premises Supervisor to be always present on the premises when alcohol is sold or supplied.

I fully understand that this Representation will be made available to the applicant and included in the Sub Committee's Hearing papers which are publicly accessible documents, and any subsequent appeal court proceedings.

A monitoring form had been submitted to the police with descriptions and added as evidence to this complaint. Picture evidence has also been attached to this representation.

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
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
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

To whom it may concern

I would like to take this opportunity to voice my concerns on an application for the above premises.

I regrettable inform you that I have grave concerns on the application as I believe that the granting of this application will only exacerbate the current problems our community are facing on a daily problem.

It is argued that inevitable our community will experience the following:

1) Prevention of Crime and Disorder – The local area is already suffering from the excess sale of alcohol extensively available from the existing off licence premises within the vicinity. I remind you that on Frodingham Road itself there are up to 14 independent premises that already sell alcohol. In addition to this we have Lidl and Sainsbury within proximity that also sell alcohol. Therefore, the area does not need another premise to supply and sell alcohol.

As a local resident I can confirm there has been an increase of alcohol bottles and alcohol related litter as well as alcohol related disturbances within our area. All of which I have brought to the attention of North Lincolnshire Council via photographic and video evidence.

It is argued that the granting of this license will encourage existing litter and an increase of the anti-social behaviour, which the police are aware of and are currently exhausting all channels to prevent and tackle this.

This application will not discourage crime and disorder and it is argued that it would encourage more detrimental attention, especially if the premise sells alcohol. I also bring to your attention that the police are already battling with the existing shops in regards, counterfeit cigarettes alcohol and underage sells.

2) Public Safety – The application does not promote the public safety aspects of the licensing objectives as the area has issues with people gathering under the influence of alcohol. A matter the local police team are already aware of and trying to tackle. The sale of alcohol in the area has increased which is argued has contributed to all the above issues.

Another premise the size of Viking Market will further exacerbate the problems in the area.

3) Prevention of Public Nuisance – The application will not prevent public nuisance as mentioned prior matters have only got worse. Having access to another Page 235 may sell alcohol could lead to further nuisance

and encourage anti-social behaviour. The law-abiding citizens are already suffering with anti-social behaviour within the area. I am aware of incidents where groups of people under the influence of alcohol have been threatening and intimidating towards member of the community who are simply walking to use local amenities and places of worship.

This will continue to happen if another premise is able to sell alcohol.


4) Protection Children from Harm – The application could contribute to exposing children to alcohol causing harm. It is known that several premises on Frodingham road have been prosecuted for the sale of illegal cigarettes and alcohol as well as selling to underage young people. The area is already a hot spot for child criminal and sexual exploitation and additional sells of alcohol and adults under the influence of alcohol increases the risks to children and young people.

I would like to suggest that instead of issuing premises license, the council should do more to tackle and prevent the sales of counterfeit cigarettes and alcohol in the area. There already exists an abundance of shops within Frodingham Road where alcohol can be purchased, and it is therefore argued we do not need another licensed shop. The residents and community are desperate for the Crosby area to be a peaceful, clean and safe environment where they can enjoy living.

I fully understand this representation will be made available to the applicant and included in the Sub Committees Hearing papers which are accessible to the public and any subsequent appeal court hearings.

I trust this clarifies my position and if further comments or evidence is required, please do not hesitate to contact me.

I would like to suggest that if a license was granted, conditions such as a security guard within the shop or restricted sales of alcohol be applied.
