### 1. OBJECT AND KEY POINTS IN THIS REPORT

- 1.1 To consider the objection received to the experimental traffic regulation order for the Lodge Moor Area.
- 1.2 The key points in this report are as follows:
  - Complaints have been received regarding inconsiderate parking on various roads on the Lodge Moor Estate, especially on match days.
  - An experimental order was made in March 2018 to prevent vehicles parking close to key junctions on the estate and help to improve the flow of traffic.
  - The objector feels that the restrictions outside her property are unfair on the residents.

#### 2. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

- 2.1 Complaints have been received regarding inconsiderate parking on various roads on the Lodge Moor Estate for a number of years. The main complaint is inconsiderate parking by those visiting the adjacent football ground. The issue has been raised by several local residents and the ward member.
- 2.2 This experimental order was implemented to prevent vehicles parking close to key junctions on the estate and help to improve the flow of traffic.
- 2.3 Restrictions were also included on Scotter Road South to remove parking bays on the approach to Berkeley Circle.

## 3. OPTIONS FOR CONSIDERATION

- 3.1 Option 1 To approve the permanent traffic regulation order and ask officers to considers an amendment to the restrictions outside of the resident's property.
- 3.2 Option 2 To uphold the objection and not implement the permanent TRO.

### 4. ANALYSIS OF OPTIONS

- 4.1 Option 1 This will allow officers to enforce the restrictions on the estate but allow for further consultation to be undertaken with the objector.
- 4.2 Option 2 This will likely lead to further complaints from residents. Readvertising the order may also lead to further objections.

# 5. **RESOURCE IMPLICATIONS (FINANCIAL, STAFFING, PROPERTY, IT)**

- 5.1 The cost of re-advertising the order is £1000, whilst staffing costs would come from within the council.
- 5.2 There are no staffing, property or IT issues related with this report.

# 6. OUTCOMES OF INTEGRATED IMPACT ASSESSMENT (IF APPLICABLE)

6.1 Officers have carried out an integrated impact assessment. There were no major issues found.

# 7. OUTCOMES OF CONSULTATION AND CONFLICTS OF INTERESTS DECLARED

- 7.1 Consultation with the ward member, statutory bodies and residents has been carried out.
- 7.2 The council has had one objection. The objector feels that the removal of parking bays on Scotter Road South is unfair on the residents who live there.

### 8. **RECOMMENDATIONS**

- 8.1 That the Traffic Regulation Order is approved, as shown on the plan in Appendix 2, and that officers consider a new order to address the concerns raised by the resident.
- 8.2 That officers' write to the objectors advising them of the decision, following the normal legal procedure.



Notice is hereby given that on 5<sup>th</sup> March 2018, North Lincolnshire Council made an Order under Section 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which is to introduce waiting restrictions on the lengths of road described in the Schedule and as per the detail shown on YHN05036/001. The Order will come into effect on 9<sup>th</sup> March 2018 for an experimental period of 18 months

A copy of the Order, together with a statement of reasons and plan showing the lengths of road affected can be seen at the Scunthorpe Local Link Office and the Council Offices, Billet Lane, Normanby Enterprise Park, Scunthorpe DN15 9YH during normal office hours throughout the duration of the Order. It is the intention of the Council to consider, in due course, whether the provisions of the Order should be continued in force indefinitely. During the operation of the Order, the Director of Operations shall have the powers of modification/suspension set out in Section 10 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

Within 6 months of the coming into force of this Order or of the latest variation or modification of it, any person may object to the making of an Order giving indefinite continuation of it. Any such objection should be in writing specifying the grounds on which it is made and sent to the Director of Operations at the Billet Lane Council Offices. If you wish to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 or a requirement of that Act or any instrument made under it has not been complied with you may, within six weeks from the date on which the Order was made, make application for that purpose to the High Court.

#### **SCHEDULE**

To introduce No Waiting at Any Time restrictions in the Lodge Moor Area as follows:

Scotter Road - between no 136 and Kingway Access Road

Moors Road – around the junctions of Edgemere and Lodge Road and additional restrictions near to bend with Bolsover Road

Bolsover Road – around the junctions with Mansfield Road and Castleton Road and additional restrictions near the bend with Minster Road

Minster Road – around the junction with Deacon Drive and Lodge Road

Chesterfield Road - around the junction with Fairways, Baslow Road and Derby Road
