Speed limit review amendment no 12 order 2018.

OBJECT AND KEY POINTS IN THIS REPORT

- 1.1 To consider objections received by the council to the proposed speed limit changes in North Lincolnshire.
- 1.2 The key points of this report are as follows:
- The proposed restrictions are part of the on-going speed limit review.
- There are objections from a resident of Winterton, Kirton Town Council and Humberside Police.

2. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

- 2.1 The speed limits on all A and B roads in North Lincolnshire have been reviewed following guidance in the Department of transport Circular 01/06 "setting local speed limits".
- 2.2 In order to clarify what speed limit applied to what road the government office (DfT) updated Circular Roads 1/93 Setting Local Speed limits. The updated document, Circular Roads 1/2006 has been revised by 01/2013. The circular aims to introduce consistency in setting speed limits on a national level.
- 2.3 These speed limits have been proposed following work carried out by officers from North Lincolnshire Council and Humberside Police using the above guidance. All roads have been assessed and driven to ensure consistency across the authority.
- 2.4 Consultation was carried out with stakeholders, ward members and local town and parish councils. Notices were displayed and maintained on site. The consultation period was extended for a further three weeks to allow direct consultation with residents and to allow Parish Councils to offer comment.

2.5 Three objections were received, each to different sections of the order. Emails of support for the changes have also been received from various residents.

3. OPTIONS FOR CONSIDERATION

- 3.1 **Option 1** To approve the proposed Traffic Regulation Order
- 3.2 **Option 2** To uphold the objections received and to re-advertise an amended order.

4. ANALYSIS OF OPTIONS

4.1 Option 1 – Approve the order, this would be the preferred option.

The 30mph on Winteringham Road was not deemed suitable as the environment is open on one side of the road; it was felt that 40mph was more appropriate and would lead to a higher level of compliance from drivers. The 50mph limit on the B1398 is proposed to create a consistent speed limit on the road and to avoid too many changes in the speed limit. The proposed 30mph limit on Burringham Road is part of the planning approval for the housing development adjacent to the road. It is felt that the addition of this development changes the environment to make a 30mph limit more appropriate.

4.2 Option 2 – Uphold the objection and re advertise the order. This would delay the introduction of speed limits at other locations identified in this speed limit order.

5. RESOURCE IMPLICATIONS (FINANCIAL, STAFFING, PROPERTY, IT)

- 5.1 The estimated cost of re-advertising the proposed TRO is £1,000.
- 5.2 There is no staffing, property or IT issues associated with this report.
- 5.3 The estimated cost of a footpath would be in the region of £50,000

6. OUTCOMES OF INTEGRATED IMPACT ASSESSMENT (IF APPLICABLE)

6.1 The integrated impact assessment did not identify any significant issues.

7. OUTCOMES OF CONSULTATION AND CONFLICTS OF INTERESTS DECLARED

7.1 The council has received three objections to the proposed order. Copies of the objections are attached at Appendix 1.

- 7.2 The first objection refers to proposed 40mph limit on the B1207 Winteringham Road, Winterton. The objector feels that the 30 mph limit should be extended out beyond the selling centre with an additional 40mph to the junction with the A1077. They feel that the current proposal is an insult.
- 7.3 The second objection is to a section of the proposed 50mph on B1398. Kirton Town Council feel that a national speed limit is more appropriate for this section of road but do support the rest of the proposed changes.
- 7.4 The third objection is from Humberside Police who feel that the 30mph is not appropriate and would not be adhered to.
- 7.5 The ward members have been consulted and no objections have been received.

8. **RECOMMENDATIONS**

- 8.1 That the Director of Operations upholds the order and authorises its introduction.
- 8.2 That officers write to the objectors advising them of the decision.

Humberside Police have considered the contents and proposals and would make the following comments/objection;

Wroot - No objection:

Stone Lane, Burringham - No objection;

Burringham Road, Scunthorpe – Humberside Police objects to this speed reduction on the grounds that this section of the road leading from the roundabout to the proposed new 30mph entry gate has recently been removed from the Speed Management Strategy through successful camera speed enforcement and changed driver behaviour. The previous speeding offender rate was significant and from drivers not obeying the 40mph (46mph+) the proposed reduction to 30mph would not, in our opinion be adhered to. This has the potential to create a much larger speeding issue than was present previously.

There has also been little or no development along this section of road which would indicate that a speed reduction is necessary. The new houses and associated junction built immediately after the roundabout are close enough to the roundabout to not be affected by traffic travelling at high speeds and so pose no extra collision/casualty risk. There are also no proposed extra pedestrian crossing facilities which would support a speed reduction. The road has also not been modernised, changed or had any extra hazards identified to justify a speed reduction.

Furthermore, the 'look and feel' of the road is such that a 30mph speed limit would not be seen as appropriate or reasonable by drivers. The road is seen to be straight, wide with no significant junctions and lined by trees, bushes and open areas.

Humberside Police is of the opinion that a reduction to a 30mph speed limit would create a more serious non-compliance issue than before and which would require a sustained and determined Police/enforcement response. A situation which should not be allowed to develop. Highway Authorities should not rely on the Police to enforce inappropriate speed limits. 40mph is an appropriate and proportionate speed limit for this section of road. A fact supported by the successful speed enforcement/driver behaviour change already evident.
