GREEN HOMES GRANT (LOCAL AUTHORITY DELIVERY) 1B

1. OBJECT AND KEY POINTS IN THIS REPORT

- 1.1 This report outlines the funding available following a successful bid to the Government's Green Homes Grant (Local Authority Delivery) external wall insulation scheme.
- 1.2 We have been awarded £1,066,400 from the Government's Green Homes Grant LAD 1B funding to deliver external wall insulation to a further 100 properties within North Lincolnshire who fit the criteria for funding.
- 1.3 To access the funding, we need to sign the Memorandum of Understanding issued by Department for Business, Energy & Industrial strategy (BEIS).

2. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

- 2.1 The nationally available Green Homes Grant went live in September 2020 and is there to help homeowners upgrade their homes and save up to £600 a year on their energy bills.
- 2.2 In addition to the national scheme, local authorities were invited to bid for funding to carry out a scheme of energy efficiency measures targeted at low-income households in their area.
- 2.3 Together with our Trustmark accredited delivery partner YES Energy Solutions, we submitted a bid for a scheme of external wall insulation and were successful. We were allocated £500,000. This was GHG LAD 1A funding.
- 2.4 The Government made available a further allocation of funding via GHG LAD 1B, with the bid having to be submitted by December 2020. We had 40 households on the waiting list for external cladding, following closure of the initial funding application window. We therefore decided to be aspirational and submitted a bid to deliver a further 100 installations. Our aim being to keep households safe and warm and enable resilient and flourishing communities.
- 2.5 Our bid was successful, with a total allocation of £1,066,400 being offered to North Lincolnshire to deliver external wall cladding to 100 properties.

3. OPTIONS FOR CONSIDERATION

- 3.1 Option one sign the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) and draw down the funding. We must have all documentation back to BEIS by the 26th of February to ensure we do not lose our allocation.
- 3.2 Option two decide not to go ahead with the additional funding.

4. ANALYSIS OF OPTIONS

- 4.1 Option one is the preferred option and ensures that we can take advantage of the funding on offer to help support our most vulnerable households to stay warm and safe at home and move out of fuel poverty. It also contributes to our priorities of enabling resilient and flourishing communities.
- 4.2 Increased deaths and admissions to hospital during winter are associated with people living in cold conditions where heating their home to a healthy temperature is costly due to poor energy efficiency.
- 4.3 Evidence is now becoming apparent on the impact of the pandemic and the lockdowns, particularly around the difficult decisions households are facing around whether they can afford to heat their home all day.

5. FINANCIAL AND OTHER RESOURCE IMPLICATIONS (e.g. LEGAL, HR, PROPERTY, IT, COMMUNICATIONS etc.)

- 5.1 There are no financial or other resource implications. We will be delivering the scheme in partnership with YES (Yorkshire Energy Services). Performance monitoring of the scheme will be met from within existing resources within the Home Assistance Team.
- 5.2 We have already consulted with Finance and Legal Services with regards the service level agreement with YES and the MOU which requires signing for BEIS. The Finance team are satisfied with the terms and conditions of the grant funding.
- 5.3 We have discussed with procurement and have a signed exception form on the basis of the total direct award to YES being £117,000 across both schemes.
- 5.3 Our Data Sharing Agreement and Privacy notice are already in place.

6.1 Improving energy efficiency also has a positive environmental impact, improving the carbon emissions from homes receiving the insulation measures. The savings in heating costs will also help take households out of fuel poverty.
