

We object due to the following reasons:

- 1. In his original application Mr Miah stated that his premises would be open from tea time until 10.30 and closed on a Tuesday. He has now moved the goal posts asking for his opening hours to be from 5 until midnight seven days a week. The two public houses in the village don't stay open that late. The Yarborough Arms shut at 10pm from Sunday through to Wednesday and shut at 11 from Thursday to Saturday. The Fox Inn shuts at 10pm every night. There is absolutely no need to have alcohol available 7 nights a week until midnight... This will encourage anti social behaviour in our village, only last week a young woman was attacked on the high street. It will also encourage littering, which will attract vermin; as the restaurant is so close and surrounded by people's homes, this is unacceptable to those who live nearby. We have also been told that waste, which will obviously contain food, will only be collected once a month, this is a big concern for us; again worrying about attracting undesirable animals/rodents close to our homes.
 - 2. The restaurant in in the middle of residential housing, the noise from patrons, possibly under the influence will cause noise and disruption to local residents disturbing their sleep and upsetting their animals. Also as there is no parking provided, there will be numerous parking issues with drives possibly being blocked and double yellow lines being used. The noise from car doors being slammed and people stopping to pick up take out food will be a huge disturbance to the surrounding houses plus will probably double the amount of traffic in the area.
 - 3. Due to the new planning legislation, although a former shop (A3 to Class E) can be turned into a restaurant, adding a drinking establishment (A4) and a hot food takeaway (A5) requires planning permission due to being 'Sui Generis'. This has not been applied for.
